WILSON WILL BUILD A ROAD FOR CITY

Not The Supervisor But A. A. Is The Man In Question

A. A. Wilson will have the job of building a stretch of county road near Kahuku. Last night the board voted to turn over to him the supervision of the work, accepting his offer to furnish the tools and do the hauling for 15 per cent of the cost of the work, the city to pay the men. Quinn, who presented the matter to the Supervisors, stated that the scheme was the same as the arrangement which the Oahu Railway, J. B. Castle, and others make with Wilson, and that its adoption would mean the saving of a considerable amount of money to the City and County.

There seemed to be some question as to the legality of the proceedings, but Deputy County Attorney Milverton expressed the belief that it was quite in order.

McClellan thought that some sort of a contract should be drawn up, so that the exact status of the city in the matter would be defined.

Kane arose and said that he did not understand the proposition, and therefore did not feel that he could vote for it. Nobody undertook to enlighten him, so his vote, on the roll call, was "No." McClellan also cast a negative vote, not furnishing any explanation for his action. All of the others present voted "yes." Cox was absent.

The County Jail will get 125 blankets. Sundry bedsteads, mattresses and other equipment will also be purchased. Quinn, in the absence of Chairman Cox of the Committee on Police, explained that since the County had taken over the municipal bastille, the discovery had been made that most of the blankets and furnishings formerly in use had been taken, as Territorial property, by High Sheriff Henry for use in his own detention establishment.

As the stuff in question was needed in a hurry, the Board voted to empower the Police Committee to make the necessary purchases in the open market.

J. W. WILKINSON DIED THIS MORNING

James William Wilkinson, who until recently has been the engineer in charge of the Kalia pump, died at 2 o'clock this morning after a lingering illness. Mr. Wilkinson's health has been failing ever since the accident at Kalia pump, in which one of the helpers, a native boy, was killed. He has been under the physician's care for some months. A wife and three children are left to mourn their loss. Mr. Wilkinson was a member of the Marine Engineers' Association and of Oceanic Lodge No. 371 F. & A. M. The funeral services will be held in the Masonic Temple at 3 o'clock this afternoon under the auspices of Oceanic Lodge, R. H. Hemrose, Master.
