## WIFE BIT FINGER AND KAPANAIA DIED

Temperance Lesson Given By Swipe Drinking On Maui

(Special to the Bulletin.)  
WAILUKU, Maui, Oct. 1.—Benjamin Kapanaia, aged 73, died at Malulu Hospital Sept. 29 of blood poisoning. Some four or five months ago Kapanaia and his wife, Kaikaha, aged 30 years, were living happily in Kaupo. One night they invited a number of their friends to their home to partake of some uala or potato swipes. The friends came and congratulated them on the superior quality of their product. During the night a quarrel arose between Kapanaia and his wife, and the latter bit off a portion of the little finger of his right hand. Months passed and he paid no attention to it. Some time during the middle of September his right hand got worse and Dr. Deas of Hana was summoned, who recommended his immediate removal to Malulu Hospital at Wailuku. Kapanaia came overland by way of Kahikinui with a police officer and presented himself for register at the hospital on Sept. 19. An automobile brought the old man from Uluvaluku to Wailuku. The following day Dr. Osmer amputated the right hand, which was in a very bad state. The old man died within thirty hours after the amputation on account of exhaustion and general blood poisoning and gangrene setting in. A coroner's inquest was held in Wailuku yesterday and continued until Saturday afternoon, when Police-man Keiki of Kaupo will arrive and give some evidence needed by the coroner's jury.

## HONOKAA BANNER CROP HARVESTED

Big Dance Given by Manager Gjerdrum to All Employees—Planters From Adjoining Mills All Attend to Throng the Ball Room.

HONOKAA, Oct. 1.—The harvesting of the Honokaa Sugar Co.'s Banner Crop, was fittingly celebrated on Saturday evening the 25th, inst., by a splendid dance given by Manager Gjerdrum.

Over the tennis ground at the manager's residence a pavilion was erected 50 ft. by 60 ft., prettily decorated by evergreens and palm leaves, and brilliantly illumined by electric lights.

The sight, viewed from the eminence immediately above the pavilion, with its galaxy of handsomely attired men and women as they moved to and fro to the strains of a dreamy waltz, is one that will long be remembered.

Refreshments were served in the palm avenue adjoining the tennis court by the light of swarming lanterns of every conceivable hue. The cuisine was in the hands of the Honokaa ladies Mesdames Hofgaard, A. C. Gibb, Jaouen and C. Buffett, and so well was their part carried out that an Epicure of Epicureans could not have found fault with the delicacies placed before the hundred odd persons present.

The genial sugar doctor, Mr. J. W. Donald, had command of the floor and put on a very diversified and very much enjoyed program; Rye Waltzes and Highland Scotchishes contributing much to the pleasure of the spectators. A "Catch as catch can" dance elicited considerable amusement—every change of the music bringing about a scramble for favorite partners, and in a few instances proving that the Honokaa males have very decided tastes in the dancing line.

The first of the home-sick ones withdrew about 1 a. m. and it was almost two hours later before the remainder of the happy and much appreciative dancers circled round the giver of the dance to the tune of "He's a Jolly Good Fellow." Mr. Gjerdrum in his reply said it gave him pleasure to see such a large and representative gathering, and especially on such an auspicious occasion—the banner crop. He thanked his colleagues for their work on the crop just harvested, and hoped they would do as well for the crop to come.
