## NEW FISHING COMPANY FORM

PRESIDENT OF KAAHUMANU  
SOCIETY STARTS A NEW  
LODGE — LIST OF JURORS  
MADE UP.

WAILUKU, Dec. 3.—Profiting by  
the experience of the Japanese who  
have already built two sixty-foot  
sampans at Kihel, the Hawaiians of  
Wailuku have organized a fishing  
company with the following officers:  
Senator W. T. Robinson, president;  
Hon. J. W. Kalua, vice president;  
Senator W. J. Coelho, secretary;  
Rev. L. B. Kaumehelwa, treasurer;  
Chas. Wilcox, auditor, and a board  
of directors consisting of W. Kukona,  
P. Goodness, Paikaka, Nicholas and  
the officers. The contract for a  
thirty-foot boat has been let with W.  
N. Halls of Kahului. The boat when  
completed will be supplied with a  
ten horse power gasoline engine.  
Since the completion of the Asahi,  
the Kihel gasoline boat, fish of the  
bonito variety have been landed in  
Wailuku from Kihel at 15 cents  
each, a fish which formerly com-  
manded 40 and 50 cents in the mar-  
ket. When the Asahi's mate is  
ready for business fish may be still  
cheaper in any of the Maui markets.  
The Asahi holds a record for bring-  
ing to the markets in one day about  
1,100 fish, and since she carried  
about twelve men, the average catch  
per man per diem is less than 100.  
Rev. S. Nawahine of Wailuku, one of  
the best fishermen on Maui of the  
old style fishing, holds a record of  
over 100 akus or bonitos in one day.  
That was an extraordinary record for  
one man in a small boat and is not  
apt to be repeated for many moons  
to come. But modern style fishing  
in up-to-date gasoline engine boats  
supplied with the latest appliances  
may however someday excel the re-  
cord now held by Nawahine.
