## BAR CONDEMNS WOOLLEY'S BILLS

ASSOCIATION DECLARES HOME RULE THREATENED

Motion Presented by Arthur Wilder is Carried Without Difficulty at Meeting of Lawyers.

The Bar Association yesterday afternoon followed in the footsteps of the Merchants' Association and the Chamber of Commerce in condemning the campaign of John G. Woolley at Washington in his effort to saddle Hawaii with a Federal prohibitory law.

A motion presented by Arthur A. Wilder was passed after some discussion, reading as follows:

"It is the sense of the Bar Association that it protests against the passage by Congress of any bill seeking to prohibit or control the liquor traffic in this Territory upon the ground that it is an invasion of the rights of the Legislature of this Territory to legislate upon that matter, which is given to us by the Organic Act."

A resolution offered by W. R. Castle was presented but could not be acted upon, Robert Breckons moving the previous question on the Wilder motion. Castle's resolution was as follows:

"Whereas, Certain bills now before the Congress of the United States propose to establish total prohibition of the liquor traffic in the Territory of Hawaii, and it is not believed that public sentiment in this Territory is ready for total prohibition, and that under such circumstances total prohibition cannot be made effective even by the United States Government; and

"Whereas, We believe that conditions are such, in regard to the traffic in liquor, more particularly as applicable to the sailors and soldiers of the United States, that there is serious danger of interference by the United States government with the entire government of this Territory, in which case the local government will be entirely destroyed; and

"Whereas, If control of the liquor traffic were assumed by the United States government, thus removing the question entirely from the arena of local politics, it would result in such improved conditions that any further interference with the general local government will not take place; therefore,

"Resolved, by the Bar Association of Hawaii, That the Congress of the United States be respectfully petitioned to take no further action with reference to the bills providing total prohibition for the Territory of Hawaii now pending; and that, in place thereof, the matter be referred to a committee or commission to inquire into conditions and report at an early date to Congress the feasibility of control by the United States government of the manufacture, sale and dealing in and with spirituous liquors, wines and beers in the Territory of Hawaii."

The discussion that preceded the adoption of the motion made by Judge Wilder brought out a number of views on the principles involved in the anti-liquor legislation now pending in Washington.

W. O. Smith questioned the propriety of an expression of views on the question of liquor traffic from the Bar Association. He declared that it did not come within the purposes for which the association was organized. In response to Mr. Smith's statement, Judge Wilder read an extract from the by-laws of the Association showing that pending legislation mentioned in a proper subject for the Association to consider.

J. A. Magoon was opposed to the Bar Association condemning the principal of Federal prohibition and stated that the liquor traffic was tolling the funeral bell for the Hawaiian people. In support of his motion Judge Wilder declared that the self-governing powers of the people were actually at stake and that a commission form of government was at hand if the pending bills carried.

M. F. Prosser was at the meeting for W. A. Kinney, president of the Bar Association. Mr. Prosser stated that Mr. Kinney was unalterably opposed to Federal prohibition believing that the people of Hawaii should deal with local questions in preservation of their right of self-government.

The officers of the association were authorized to cable the Association action against the Curtis and Johnson bills to Washington last night.
