IMPROVING OF HANAPEPE BAY

Further Investigations Will Be Made Shortly

(Special Correspondence.) WASHINGTON, March 21.—The Acting Chief of Engineers transmitted today (March 21) the report of Major Winslow on proposed improvements of Hanapepe Bay, Island of Kauai. Apparently, the rivalry between different places as to the exact point to be improved as a harbor has delayed the contemplated improvements. The letter of the acting chief submitting the report to the Secretary of War and transmitted through the latter to Congress is as follows:

"I have the honor to submit herewith for transmission to Congress reports dated May 14, 1909, and January 10, 1910, with map, by Major E. E. Winslow, corps of engineers, on preliminary examination and survey, respectively, called for by the river and harbor act approved March 3, 1909, of Hanapepe Bay, Island of Kauai, Hawaii.

"The district officer presents several plans for improvement of this locality, involving expenditures varying in cost from \$450,000 to \$900,000 for construction and \$25,000 to \$40,000 annually for maintenance. He believes that the commercial and navigation interests of the Island of Kauai are of sufficient importance to justify the United States in constructing one good harbor on the island, but it has developed that a number of persons having interests on this island claim that there are other harbors on the island which lend themselves more favorably to improvement.

"Since Hanapepe is the only harbor yet surveyed and information concerning the other harbors is not available, he does not feel justified at present in recommending improvement of the locality, now under consideration; but in view of the necessity that something be done in behalf of the commercial interests, he recommends that Congress authorize an examination at an early date with a view to the selection of the most suitable part for a harbor.

"I concur with the district officer, the division engineer, and the board of engineers for rivers and harbors in the opinion that it is not available at the present time for the general

government to undertake the improvement of Hanapepe Bay and authority should be given by Congress to examine the coast of Kauai with a view to the selection of the most suitable port for a harbor.

"The pending river and harbor bill contains a provision for the examination of the coast of Kauai with a view to the selection of the most suitable port for a harbor. It is pretty certain that the Hawaiian items will be in the bill when presented to the President for final approval.

HIGHER EXCURSION RATES ON HAWAII

There has been a general raise in excursion rates on the island of Hawaii. There are various trips, of stated number of days at different points of interest on the big island that have been in force for some time. The rates on these various trips have been raised in amounts ranging from \$2 to \$15.

The Hilo-cross-island route made in seven days with three days at the Volcano House, has been boosted from \$51 to \$55. The ten-day trip, including 6 days at the Volcano House, was formerly \$90, but now costs \$95.50. The fourteen-day trip, including ten days at the Volcano House, was listed at \$75. It now costs \$80.

The same raises of prices continue down the line. The eight-day trip is raised from \$54 to \$57.50; the eleven-day trip from \$60 to \$68; and all other trips including stops at the Volcano House, are proportionately boosted.


