### NOW TOMMY BURNS GOT BEST OF LANG

Decision Is Not Considered Good One—Crowd Thought Draw Would Have Been Fair.

Tommy Burns seemed to have had a lot of luck in getting the decision over Bill Lang. In their fight, and the latter must be given credit for having improved a lot since he was beaten by Jack Johnson a couple of years ago. The following cabled account of the contest between the Australian champion and Burns will be read with interest:

Tommy Burns, the American heavyweight who lost the championship of the world to Jack Johnson, was awarded the decision over Bill Lang of Australia at the end of twenty rounds of boxing here today. Burns was the favorite at odds of 3 to 1 when the fight started, but the decision in his favor was not well received by the crowd, most of whom thought that Lang had at least held his own. Hugh D. McIntosh was the referee, and he gave the verdict to Burns on points.

Seventeen thousand people witnessed the fight, which was held in the daytime in perfect weather. Burns' weight was 181 pounds, while Lang tipped the beam at 185 pounds. Both men wore bandages. Burns had the advantage in the first ten rounds, which were full of fast fighting. In the sixth round the American forced Lang through the ropes and was roundly hoisted by the spectators. The Australian pugilist, when he got back into the ring, shook hands with Burns.

The best round for Burns was the ninth, in which he punished Lang severely. He landed many hard punches, but Lang fought back bravely and Burns could not floor him. In the twelfth Lang rallied in fine shape and twice connected with hard rights on Burns' jaw after the American fighter had jarred him with a hard left on the nose.

In the last eight rounds of the fight Lang fought cautiously in spite of the fact that Burns was weakening perceptibly. Tommy fell into clinches at every opportunity and prevented the Australian champion from doing any great damage.
