COLLEGE TEAM TO TOUR AUSTRALIA. Berkeley, Nevada and Stanford University Rugby Players to Leave May 17.

BERKELEY, May 4.—The University of California, Stanford University and the University of Nevada will combine to send a football team to Australia and New Zealand during the coming summer under a guarantee provided by the New South Wales Rugby Union. The arrangements have just been completed by a cablegram to Manager Ralph P. Merritt of the University of California, by which a definite agreement is made to provide hotel and traveling expenses.

The team will be managed by D. W. Burbank, graduate manager of Stanford University. There will be 23 players and the coach and trainer. There will be two players from the University of Nevada, 10 from Stanford University and 11 from the University of California. The names of the players will be announced by D. W. Burbank, manager of the trip, as soon as the final selection of men is made. The team which will represent the Coast universities will be the strongest one which it is possible to get together for this international trip. The schedule of the trip is as follows: Leave San Francisco about May 17; leave Vancouver May 29; arrive Brisbane June 11; play at Brisbane (Queensland) June 18 and 22; play at Sydney (New South Wales) June 25, 29, July 2, 6; play at Wellington July 16; play at Christchurch July 20; play at Dunin (New Zealand) July 23; play at Wellington (New Zealand) July 30; play at Auckland August 2 to catch Vancouver steamer at Suva; arrive Vancouver August 23.

This is the most important trip ever undertaken by a team representing the Pacific Coast universities. The financial burden is to be borne entirely by the New South Wales Rugby Union. The trip is made possible through the visit of the Wallabies team a year ago last fall and the courtesies shown to them by the various clubs and universities of the Coast and later by the visit of W. J. Howe, assistant coach of the University of California.

TWO MATCHES PLAYED IN Y.M.C.A. HANDBALL. Marcellino and St. John Win Their Contests—Championship is in Doubt. There were two matches played in the Y. M. C. A. handball tournament yesterday, and both of them were won easily as far as actual scores go. But the games were much closer than the reports would indicate, and there were many long rallies before some of the aces were decided.

RAPID SPREAD OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE. LONDON—It is frequently remarked by travelers that, with a knowledge of the English language, you can make yourself understood in most countries. There are certainly but few hotels in Germany, France or Switzerland where the waiters do not speak it more or less fluently, and in this connection it is interesting to note, according to statistics published recently in an Italian paper, that there are at the present time 100,000,000 people who talk English, whereas a century ago the number did not exceed 20,000,000. The use of the English language has spread at a greater rate than any of the other modern languages. One hundred years ago there were 34,000,000 people who spoke French, whereas now there are not more than 46,000,000. In regard to German, 70,000,000 speak the language today against 36,000,000 100 years ago. It is said that the Russian language is spoken by 69,000,000 as against 30,000,000 100 years ago, while only 18,000,000 spoke Italian against 32,000,000 today.
