There was nothing done in the settlement line as Son started a rough house at once. The row spread till several Koreans were mixed up in the yepap, and then it is alleged that Son drew a knife. He could not get an opportunity to use it however, and he then resorted to kicking his late landlord. Judge Andrade listened to the story and then fined Son, as above reported.
