The Japanese were caught playing Jo-han in a tenement located on Dowsett lane. The officers had been attracted to the scene through the boisterous conduct of an inebriated individual who was attempting to correct a member of his family. The air was more or less blue with effervescent language when the minions of the law appeared on the scene. It was while trying to quell the family disturbance that the modest but unmistakable noise of moving chips and the clink of coin were heard by the ever alert ears of the chief.

The apartment, some twelve by eight feet in extent, was broken into, and before the surprised Japanese had time to recover from their surprise the officers had confiscated some \$6 in money, cards and chips and other damaging evidence. They deposited half of \$19 each, which was forfeited when the "use" was called this morning.
