EXPLOSION COSTS TWO MILLIONS

(Associated Press Cable.)

NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—Following the explosion in the auxiliary power house at the Grand Central station, the utmost consternation prevailed in the district. The rush of the ambulances and patrol wagons, the screams of women in nearby houses, gaping and shattered windows, the stampede of hundreds who were waiting in trains, all joined in adding to the confusion until the police were able to restore a semblance of order.

One strange occurrence was the effort of the explosion upon a Madison avenue street car, which was passing at the time. This car, which contained seven passengers, was lifted from the track and hurled directly upon a passing automobile, and several persons were injured.

What with the smashed windows, jarred foundations of buildings and the damage to the power house and machinery, it is estimated that the financial losses will reach between two and three million dollars.

HUNTING OUT ROOSEVELT'S BILLS.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 19.—Much interest is being manifested in Congressional circles here by a resolution introduced in the House of Representatives today by Congressman Henry T. Rainey for the appointment of a commission to investigate the bills introduced in Congress by Theodore Roosevelt while he was President.

Rainey, who is a Democrat representing the Twentieth Congressional District of Illinois, is believed to have some special motive in advocating such an investigation, which has not been made public. He is an attorney and has been a member of the Fifty-eighth, Fifty-ninth and Sixty-first Congresses over James H. Danks, Republican by over 6,000 majority.

STRIKERS ACCEPT EMPLOYERS' TERMS

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 19.—The long strike of the machinists and blacksmiths on the Missouri Pacific Railroad, which began May 2, has practically ended in a victory for the company, the strikers today accepting the terms offered them.

SAN JOSE FEELS SHOCK.

SAN JOSE, Cal., Dec. 19.—This city was slightly shaken today by an earthquake shock, which caused some consternation but no damage. The shock lasted but a few seconds and was not repeated.

TOMORROW LAST DAY OF GRACE

Unless the city fathers take advantage of the parcel of land freely offered the municipality by the Dillinghams for the purpose of widening Alexander street, and commence work on that improvement by tomorrow, the tender of real estate will be withdrawn and the piece that has been moved back on the property in question must be returned to its former position. This matter has been under consideration by the Board of Supervisors for a number of weeks and several communications have passed between the city council and the donors of the real estate. It is claimed by the members of the board that there are a number of very pressing matters demanding attention at the closing of the present board's term of office. The widening of Alexander street has been one that has had to await its turn.
