

WOULD PREVENT SAMPAN TRAFFIC

(Special Bulletin Correspondence.)
WAILUKU, March 3.—The Board of Trustees of the Maui Chamber of Commerce held a meeting at the office of County Attorney D. H. Case, its secretary, yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock and the following resolution by Mr. J. N. S. Williams, seconded by Judge A. N. Kepoikali, was unanimously adopted:

"That the Board of Trustees of the Maui Chamber of Commerce petition the Board of Health in preventing the traffic of fishing sampans and other small fishing craft of every description from running between Oahu and the other islands."

Secretary Case wired the above resolution soon afterwards, a reply being received from President E. A. Mott-Smith within an hour, giving assurance that the Territorial Board of Health would take immediate action in carrying out the resolution of the Board of Trustees. And it is possible that the said Board would see that the steamers Claudine and Mikahala will not be permitted to have free communication with the people on any of our seaports.

Another motion by Mr. Penhallow, seconded by Mr. Lurkin, to the effect that Sheriff Clement Crowell be instructed to give word to his officers telling them not to allow any fishing craft from the other islands, more particularly Oahu, to land on any points on Maui or have any communications with the people on the shore. The committee on membership reported favorably the application of Mr. F. P. Baldwin, manager of the Hawaiian Commercial & Sugar Co., and Mr. Baldwin was declared admitted to membership.

MAUI, March 3.—The water has been let into the new Kula pipe line, but the 12-inch wooden pipes leading from the waterhead for four miles before they are connected to the 12-inch iron pipes are leaking so badly that the full force of the water has not been let into the pipes. The Kahului Railroad Company was the contractor for the four miles of wooden pipes, and Minister Campbell may require the said corporation to put the pipes in serviceable condition in accordance with the terms of the contract. Branch connections in the Kula district are being done by county officials.

Edgar Morton, Deputy Sheriff of Makawao District, Maui County, has been at last obliged to tender his resignation to Sheriff Clement Crowell. Mr. Morton has been an able officer, but at the same time he has been indiscreet and impolitic. No one has as yet been appointed to the vacancy. The name of Mr. D. H. Keilina of Makana, and formerly of the Honolulu police force, has been favorably mentioned, but it is most likely that Sheriff Crowell will appoint Mr. P. N. Kahokoluna.
