
"MID-PACIFIC" OUT TODAY

Cable News

MEXICAN WAR CAUSES ALARM

(Associated Press Cable) CITY OF MEXICO, Apr. 16.—Government officials have now thrown off further attempts to minimize the gravity of the situation faced by the Diaz administration. It is acknowledged on all sides that the revolution is gaining alarming headway throughout the entire republic.

Call for Volunteers.

Today a general call for volunteers was made by the Department of War, coupled with promises that the increased pay would be paid to all men in the field.

Madero Ready to Strike.

JUAREZ, Chihuahua, Apr. 16.—The advance guard of the federals came into touch today with the insurgents and a continued skirmish was kept up throughout the afternoon. It is believed that Madero with his main army is within striking distance.

Washington Perturbed.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Apr. 16.—There is much perturbation in official circles here over the increasing seriousness of the Mexican situation. President Taft remained up until midnight last night, receiving frequent bulletins from the American forces on the Mexican line and from the State Department regarding Mexican developments.

NAVAL ORDNANCE CHIEF RESIGNS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Apr. 16.—Rear-Admiral Mason, U. S. N., who has been chief of the ordnance bureau of the Navy Department under the Meyer plan, yesterday tendered his resignation, which was accepted. His successor has not yet been named.

ANTI-MORMON RIOT.

BIRKENHEAD, Eng., Apr. 16.—The campaign that is being carried on here against the proselyting work of the Mormon elders brought on a clash between Mormons and anti-Mormons today, which ended in a riot. Several persons were injured.

THE TOLEDO BLADE SUFFERS FROM FIRE

TOLEDO, O., Apr. 16.—The office of the Toledo Blade, one of the largest newspapers of the State, was gutted by fire last night. No lives were lost, but the plant is a total loss.

BIDDLE GOES TO WASHINGTON.

SAN FRANCISCO, Apr. 16.—When Colonel Biddle, Corps of Engineers, U. S. A., who is now en route from Honolulu, reaches this city he will find awaiting him orders directing him to proceed on to Washington for duty with the general staff.

HAWAII'S CHANCE IN THE SCHOOLS

Theodore Richards Says It is of International Importance.

"We of Hawaii have a wonderful opportunity in our public schools to promote the friendliness of nations," declared Theodore Richards last night, speaking to a big audience at Central Union church. "The unlimited diversity of race and color makes for peculiar conditions, and it is our duty so to conduct our schools that distinctions of race and color are forgotten. That is not only Christianity, it is good business. I say to you, not as an altruist but for a simple statement of fact, that if we should break out, we are at the mercy of our neighbors to the westward."

Mr. Richards delivered the address of the evening on "A Challenge to Friendliness," in which he told of some experiences in connection with his recent trip to Japan, when he made arrangements for the five "peace scholarships" at Mid-Pacific Institute. He also made arrangements, he said last night, for an Oriental edition of "The Friend."

Central Union church was crowded last night and crowded even more closely yesterday morning. Easter Sunday in Honolulu was celebrated widely by sacred observances. Elaborate music, beautiful flowers and a fine day brought out thousands of worshippers, and the more fashionable churches here witness to the formal opening of the spring season by a wealth of military displayed in every possible manner.

Practically all of the churches had special offerings, and the amounts taken in ran into the thousands.

At Central Union the services both morning and evening were largely musical, the double quartette and soloists being featured. Six services were held during the day at St. Andrews' Cathedral, while the two services at the Methodist church on Beretania street were distinctly easter in character. High pontifical mass at the Catholic cathedral in the morning brought forth a great crowd of devoutly-minded.

At the small churches and missions the spirit of Easter was just as strong, though the services were not so elaborate. At the Chinese mission Easter Sunday was particularly picturesque.
