## What They Are Doing

**ROSE PITONOFF THE STRONGEST WOMAN IN AMERICA—WILL MRS. CURIE BE ELECTED A MEMBER OF THE FRENCH ACADEMY OF SCIENCES?—THE ONLY WOMAN DREDGER.**

ROSE PITONOFF, the fifteen-year-old girl who is the world's champion swimmer, uses the long breast stroke with marked grace and agility. There is both power in her stroke and power held in reserve. Her legs are almost motionless.

This young woman is pronounced by Dr. Sargent of Harvard to be the strongest woman in America. He uses her as an example in his lectures of how the modern woman is improving physically.

"The woman of today," he says, "is no longer the weak, puny, hysterical little thing that faints on the slightest provocation, but a creature that with

physical prowess has attained increased powers of self control and mental poise."

The French Academy of Sciences is debating whether to admit Mme. Curie, the discoverer of radium, or not. It is admitted that she deserves the honor, but there is an archaic rule against admitting women to the academy. To admit Mme. Curie it would be necessary to abolish this rule, and many of the scientists are opposed to this, as they hold Napoleonic views on the subject of woman and believe that her position is only in the nursery. M. Curie, who with his wife discovered the precious radium, was made a member of the academy, and by a singular coincidence were his widow to be elected she would occupy his chair.

A woman dredger is certainly an oddity even in these strenuous days. Seventy-year-old Ellen Ross of Harrisburg, Pa., carries on this unique business. She digs sand and coal from the bed of the Susquehanna river and disposes of building and fuel material. She has a force of fifteen men working under her orders and visits them repeatedly to see that they are working briskly and that the machinery is in good order.

# MADERO CALLS ON LA BARRA

(Associated Press Cable.)

MEXICO CITY, June 7.—General Madero's first call, after the greeting by the populace of the city, was at the national palace, which had been slightly damaged by the earthquake, where he was welcomed by President de la Barra. The meeting between Madero and de la Barra was a most cordial one.

Later in the day the square in front of his residence was packed by thousands who serenaded Madero until he addressed them from a balcony. He predicted that hereafter a truer democracy would prevail, not only in Mexico, but over the entire continent.

**Loyalty Questioned.** JUAREZ, June 7.—The loyalty of the federal soldiers in Chihuahua who were selected by General Madero to subdue the Socialists in Lower California is questioned, and the orders for their departure have been revoked.
