JAPAN HAS NEW PREMIER

(Associated Press Cable.)
TOKYO, Japan, Aug. 24.—Marquis Katsura, premier of Japan, placed his resignation in the hands of the Mikado today. The resignation was accepted and the Marquis Kin-Mochi Saionji was called to the head of the cabinet as premier.

The resignation of Premier Katsura has been expected for some time, and therefore the change came without disturbing the present conditions in any way.

KRUTTSCHNITT GOES TO SETTLE LABOR TROUBLE

CHICAGO, Ill., Aug. 24.—Julius Kruttschnitt, traffic manager of the Southern Pacific railroad, started from this city today for San Francisco and will confer with the presidents of five of the principal unions of railway employees and shopmen.

There are a number of grievances which the men desire to have remedied, but the principal question to be discussed is in regard to the blanket agreement between the unions and the railroad company, the present agreement soon coming to an end.

The threat by the railway officials to lay off several thousand men on account of financial conditions has brought matters to a head, and the conferences between the traffic manager of the road and the presidents of the unions will mark a new epoch in the management of the Southern Pacific.

The agreement which it is expected will be the outcome of the conferences will involve 90,000 workmen.

SECRETARY FISHER BESTED BY ELEMENTS

CORDOVA, Alaska, Aug. 24.—Secretary Fisher of the Department of the Interior, who is visiting Alaska to investigate the charges made in regard to Controller Bay lands, was caught with his party in a severe storm while on the way today.

For a time the entire party was in considerable danger, and it was principally owing to the seamanship of the officers and crew of the steamer that the members finally reached harbor in safety.

NEGRO RESCUED WHEN NEARLY BURNED TO DEATH

PURCELL, Okla., Aug. 24.—Peter Carter, a negro charged with making an assault upon a white woman, was taken by a mob here today, carried into the suburbs and an effort made to burn him alive.

Before the victim was dead, however, he was rescued by the police and deputy sheriffs and taken to the hospital, but his injuries are so serious that it is reported he will die.

EAGLES ELECT NATIONAL PRESIDENT

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Aug. 24.—At the national convention of the Fraternal Order of Eagles in this city today, Frank Hering of Indiana was elected national president.

The order made a fine showing in a great parade this morning, when four thousand Eagles marched in line through the streets with nearly a score of bands.

ATWOOD IS AGAIN DELAYED.

NYACK, N. Y., Aug. 24.—Aviator Harry Atwood, who is making a flight from St. Louis to New York city, reached here today after a sustained flight of seventy-six miles, which breaks his record for a single flight so far. He had hoped to make his goal in one flight, but was forced to stop because of trouble with his engine.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Aug. 24.—The new steel bridge across the Umpqua river here, which was in course of construction, fell today and five of the crew of workmen were killed.

BAYONETS AGAIN USED ON STRIKERS

BARGOED, Eng., Aug. 24.—Rioting was renewed in this city today, and once more the troops were called upon to restore order. It took several bayonet charges to disperse the mobs.

REPORTED RESIGNATION OF DIAZ IS NOT TRUE

MANAGUA, Nic., Aug. 24.—The report that President Diaz has resigned and that General Mena is president of Nicaragua is false.

MADERO WINS AGAIN.

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 24.—A report has been received from General Francisco Madero that the Zapatistas have been disbanded. General Emiliano Zapatta, who started a small revolution in the State of Morelos, has been beaten.

WILLING TO FACE CHARGE.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Aug. 24.—Detective Sergeant Hossick, who is wanted in Indianapolis, Ind., on a charge of kidnaping the McNamara brothers, has voluntarily gone to that city to face the charge.

NEW PRESIDENT OF G. A. R. ROCHESTER, N. Y., Aug. 24.—Harvey M. Trimble was elected commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic at its annual national encampment here today.
