### SUPERVISORS INVITE PUBLIC

Taxpayers and all interested citizens are invited to be present at a meeting of the board of city and county supervisors which has been called for 7:30 on Thursday evening, at which time a general discussion of the new municipal appropriation bill will take place.

This measure is of vital interest to the community as a whole, as it will regulate the expenditure of moneys by the city fathers for the next six months.

The recommendation that the public be taken into the consideration of the measure came from Supervisor Low.

A communication was received by the board from the Chamber of Commerce, through H. P. Wood, the secretary, asking if the board would be willing to confer with the legislative committee of the chamber with reference to the proposed 1912 city budget.

Mr. Wood stated that he was instructed to state that the committee had the best interests of the city at heart, as it believed also the supervisors had, and a conference would be appreciated.
