## FLOOD SCLAIM EIGHTEEN LIVES

(Associated Press Cable.)  
HICKMAN, Ky., Apr. 5.—With damages to property already approaching the two million mark and with a loss to date of eighteen lives, the flood situation along four hundred miles of the Mississippi is approaching a crisis.  
From the Illinois line to as far south as Natchez, Miss., the flood reports are coming in, and with each report of continued high water and rising levels apprehension increases among the hundreds of thousands in danger.  
Today the levees protecting the Reelfoot Lake district of Tennessee gave way and the district is under water. Thousands caught in the flood are in grave peril and aid from three States is being rushed to the stricken section.  
Many thousands of laborers are engaged along the levees from this point to New Orleans, strengthening the banks with sandbags or patrolling on the watch for the first sign of a break.  
National aid in the crisis is being invoked.

### PEARY THINKS SCOTT ALSO FOUND POLE

NEW YORK, N. Y., Apr. 5.—Commander Peary, discoverer of the North Pole, expresses a belief, from information he has received, that Captain Scott, the British antarctic explorer, reached the South Pole within a month after Captain Amundsen planted the Norwegian flag at the earth's southern axis.  
Captain Scott, he thinks, found the records of the earlier discovery and for that reason decided to stay in the south for further exploration and scientific work rather than hasten out.

### LA FOLLETTE OPENS FIGHT IN THE WEST

LINCOLN, Neb., Apr. 5.—Senator La Follette opened his campaign in this State today, making a vigorous speech in behalf of his own candidacy for the Republican nomination and appealing to the Republican voters to uphold the stand taken by the Progressives.

### MORE FREE LIST COMMODITIES.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Apr. 5.—Representative E. R. Bathrick of Ohio, Democrat, today introduced a bill placing on the free list meats, flour and cereals.

### WILSON SPEAKS TO ILLINOIS HEARERS

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Apr. 5.—Woodrow Wilson, Democratic candidate for his party's nomination for the presidency, began a campaign for the support of Illinois today in a speech here.

### MEXICANS DESTROY BRIDGE.

EL PASO, Tex., Apr. 5.—The railroad bridge crossing the Rio Grande at this point, and connecting this city with Juarez, Mex., was partially wrecked by dynamite today.

### Rebels Get Guns.

JIMINEZ, Mex., Apr. 5.—Parral, an important city of Chihuahua, fell into the hands of the rebels today, the federal troops evacuating the city, leaving their artillery behind them.

### HOW COAST POLICE HANDLE HIGHBINDER MEN

SAN FRANCISCO, March 14.—Warned by the Chinese Consul-General, Li Yung-Yow, that all efforts to bring about a permanent truce between the warring highbinder factions of the State had been useless, Chief of Police White issued orders today that the regular Chinatown squad be augmented by policemen instructed to shoot to kill at the first indication of trouble.  
At the end of a truce declared for the period represented by the Chinese new year, an additional truce of forty-eight hours was arranged. Efforts were made to make the agreement permanent. The Sen Sney Mings, however, backed by the Sney Sings and the Hip Sings, refused to recede from their demand that the Hop Sings pay \$15,000 and make an apology for the death of a Sen Sney Sing man killed in the recent war. Peace negotiations were abandoned. Shotguns for Chinatown Police.  
SAN JOSE, Cal., March 14.—Sawed-off shotguns were issued here to the Chinatown police today, with orders to shoot any Chinese attempting to discharge firearms. This precaution was taken following reports received by the Hop Sing Tong that dozens of imported highbinders were lying in wait intending to murder Hop Sings.
