GREATER DOCKS FOR BIG LINERS

LONDON, March 28.—The question of building vessels 1000 feet long has been much discussed in shipping circles for some years past. Many naval architects are ready with plans, and it is not difficult to find shipbuilders who are anxious to undertake the work, but the drydock still remains an insuperable difficulty.

The Titanic, the sister ship to the Olympic, 852 feet long, is now being fitted out at Belfast in the largest drydock in the world; but the Hamburg-American liner Imperator, 880 feet, has been built in a German yard, while on the Clyde the Cunard liner Aquitania, of 865 feet, is approaching completion. Harland & Wolff have accepted a contract from the White Star line for a steamer slightly under 900 feet long.

These are the largest vessels in existence either in service or building, and will probably retain that position for many years to come. It is said that if the Olympic had not been in English waters when the recent typhoon overtook her, no drydock sufficiently large would have been available, and it is difficult to see how she could have been repaired.

The great drydock at Belfast is 901 feet long and 96 feet wide, but the harbor commissioners, according to a correspondent of the Pall Mall Gazette, have instructed their engineer to prepare plans for its enlargement. The Clyde Trust has begun to construct a graving dock with a length of no less than 1000 feet, but before deciding upon the width the opinion of the admiralty is being obtained, as it is rumored that warships will be 100 feet broad before many years have passed.

The port of London authorities are about to undertake the most important scheme of dock construction which has ever been thought of with regard to the Thames, involving a total expenditure of upward of £14,000,000. The first extensions to be undertaken at an estimated cost of £5,800,000, include a dry dock 800 feet long in which vessels of 35,000 tons, as large as the Lusitania and the biggest battleships can be dry-docked.

It is wonderful to hear that the Mersey, already possessing 68 wet docks, and basins and 21 graving docks, and with a total quayage of 36 miles, is preparing for further enlargements. These concern more particularly developments at the north end where a deep water approach will be supplied for steamers 1100 feet, the cost of the project being about £5,000,000.

RUSSIAN SHIPPING FIRM ORDERING SIX MOTOR STEAMERS

ODESSA, Russ., Mar. 21.—The Russian Steam Navigation & Trading Co. has placed an order for six motor-driven vessels with the English shipbuilding firms of Messrs. W. Denny & Bros. and John Brown & Co., Ltd. The vessels are to carry passengers and mails between Odessa and Alexandria, including Constantinople, and between Odessa and Crimean and Caucasian ports.

The directorate of the Russian Navigation Company directed an expert to watch the result of the East Asiatic Company's experiment in motor ships which resulted in the unqualified success of the Schanid, and in consequence of this resolved that the new boats for the mail service of the Black Sea should be fitted with oil-driven engines. If these prove a success, it is stated that six more vessels will be built for the same company.

BOY GETS SUDDEN STROKE: IS DROWNED IN STREAM

Thought to have been suddenly overcome while he was leaning over the bank of a stream at Moanalua yesterday a Hawaiian boy named Joseph A. Mokuamala, son of J. K. Mokuamala of Moanalua, was found dead by some Chinese girls.

The body was lying half in and half out of the water, the face being submerged. Dr. Baldwin ascribed death to an injury received at football some three years ago at Kamehameha school. The information gathered yesterday was that the boy went to the stream to wash his shirt and it is thought that while stooping down he suddenly became dizzy and being powerless to move fell into the water.

PULLS RAZOR ON OFFICER: IS HIT WITH SODA BOTTLE

During a disturbance at Iwili shortly after 1 o'clock yesterday morning negroes from the transport Logan pulled razors and threatened to make trouble. Mounted Officer Cramer rushed to the scene and his horse dumped a big buck negro up and dumped him on one side of the road. Incensed by such treatment the negro rushed at the officer but was hit on the side of the head by a full soda-water bottle thrown by a sailor standing by. The rest of the negroes were dispersed and the wounded man taken to the transport in the patrol wagon.
