King Oscar II. of Sweden, the best beloved monarch in Europe, died in the royal palace at Stockholm, after a long illness. The announcement of his death was received with greatest sorrow, large crowds standing with heads bowed and streaming eyes long after the official announcement of the death. King Oscar was regarded as the most learned man in Europe, being a philosopher and student of many things, and his reign had been an eventful one. No trouble is expected as a result of his death, and the succession will pass without dissension.

### State Constitutions.

In the current number of Sturm's Oklahoma Magazine is a well written article by our former young townsman, Henry G. Snyder. This article is the first of a series which is thus referred to by the editor:

"We are pleased to announce that we have secured the services of Mr. Henry G. Snyder for the preparation of a series of articles dealing with the history of the origin and development of State Constitutions, and particularly with those innovations introduced in the Oklahoma Constitution, treating the causes and effects of such innovations. Mr. Snyder is Secretary of the Faculty, and Professor of Law in the Law Department of Epworth University, and by training and experience is one of the best qualified men in Oklahoma for such work."

The article is illustrated with an excellent picture of Mr. Snyder, whom the News congratulates upon his accession to authorship.

### How He Is Paid.

Once every month Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Reynolds presents his signature to President Roosevelt. It is no ordinary signature, either, not only because the Reynolds autograph is a most wonderful piece of work, but because it is worth exactly \$4,166.66.

This is the President's monthly salary, which is drawn to his order in the form of a Treasury warrant. Once the Treasury made a mistake in making out the salary of the President, when Grover Cleveland was in the White House. Through an error, the warrant one month was made out for one cent less than it should have been. When the error was checked up, the department very formally sent Mr. Cleveland a warrant for one cent, the smallest Treasury warrant ever drawn. That warrant has never been presented for payment, and it is said that it now hangs framed in Mr. Cleveland's library.

According to the state law the general assembly convenes on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January. Therefore, the legislature this year will convene on Tuesday, January 7, and will remain in session for sixty days. The session is expected to be one of the most important in the history of the state of Kentucky. A. S. Bennett, secretary of the Republican state central committee was asked if the Republicans would make nominations for all the places to be filled in the organization of the assembly and he replied, that in the caucus of the Republicans a nomination would be made for every place

### A Pensionable Status.


