How the Coconuts from Tahiti are Handled and Shipped.

The barquentine City of Papeete, from Tahiti, is one of the regular line of packets that trade directly between this port and the Society Islands.

When the arriving vessel is discharged the nuts are piled up on the dock and a number are sold to dealers.

The work is quite laborious, as the fibrous covering is very tough and stringy.

The "opener" takes the nut in his left hand and strikes the shell several smart raps with his opening knife.

After leaving the mills a certain amount of granulated sugar is mixed with the ground nuts in strips.

THE HABITS OF "BOB WHITE"

A Sportsman Writes About His Experiences with the Quail.

In studying the quail one cannot fail to notice the almost complete change of habits in this bird which attends the transition from one season of the year to another.

So tame and regardless of her own safety does the female go in the nesting season that not infrequently she will allow herself to be almost trodden upon before leaving the nest.

Young quail are perfect little nervousness. Almost as soon as they are out of the shell they seem to have the power of making themselves invisible at the wave of a wand.

The philosophy of this result is easy enough to explain, for, quickly as a covey of quail may seem to the excited sportsman to fly together when they are flushed, a little calm observation will show that the intervals between the several birds are almost always nearly as great as the spread of a charge of shot at thirty yards.

Therefore, my advice to the true sportsman in quail shooting is to select one bird for each barrel; make a clean kill or none at all.
