Doran, is up and will be able to get out in a few days. Lizzie O'Neil, is up and around, never had it very bad. Martin Wilson, it he had it all, is well. Roy, the little colored child is up and will soon be well, these are all the cases we have in town.

"For some of the Mexicans, who all live out side of the town, are all convalescent or entirely well, but will not be released from quarantine until we are fully satisfied that all necessary precautions have been taken to insure the disease not being spread again.

"We think the worst is now over, and see no reason why, if strict observance to sanitary measures is paid, we need have any more trouble from the disease."

Fatal Accident. On Sunday last Henry Baker, a young man who recently arrived from Medina City, Texas, was killed by the accidental discharge of a Winchester shot gun. He was riding in a dog cart with the mail carrier, between Red Rock and Duncan and had a loaded Winchester shot gun, with a cartridge in the chamber, standing upon the bottom of the vehicle with the muzzle against his body. The cart passed over a trap made making a very heavy lurch. The butt of the gun dropped off the wagon the hammer striking one of the irons at the bottom of the vehicle, with such force as to break the thumb held by which the gun is cocked, and exploding the cartridge in the chamber. The lead of shot entered the young man's abdomen, ranging upward, and causing death instantly. He reeled from the cart and was dead when his companion picked him up. An inquest was held, Justice of the Peace Louis Champie, of Red Rock, presiding at the inquest. A verdict in accordance with the facts was rendered.—Silver City Enterprise.

Yesterday we called upon Dr. Wells, health officer for this precinct, and was given the following facts regarding the small pox condition in town: "Burton of the St. James Hotel is well, and ready to be released from quarantine. Doran, is up and will be able to get out in a few days. Lizzie O'Neil, is up and around, never had it very bad. Martin Wilson, it he had it all, is well. Roy, the little colored child is up and will soon be well, these are all the cases we have in town.

"For some of the Mexicans, who all live out side of the town, are all convalescent or entirely well, but will not be released from quarantine until we are fully satisfied that all necessary precautions have been taken to insure the disease not being spread again.

"We think the worst is now over, and see no reason why, if strict observance to sanitary measures is paid, we need have any more trouble from the disease."

This is the condition of matters regarding small pox in this town today. Of course "it" is reasonable that some who have been in direct contact with it as nurses and attendants, may be taken down yet. But we are assured that, as all possible precautions have been used, if such is the case, they will have nothing more than the verifoloid.

The committee who has had these matters in charge are entitled to great credit for the strict measures adopted by them in all cases to prevent the spreading of the disease, and to their untiring efforts, to which we owe the successful conclusion of our town today.

SURE CURE FOR SMALL POX

Pass this in your scrap book. It may prove profitable. A cure for small pox and scarlet fever, given by Dr. Alfred Murray, is composed of one grain of salicylate of zinc, one grain of digitalin, (commonly known as foxglove) and a half teaspoonful of sugar. This is to be thoroughly mixed with two teaspoonfuls of water and four ounces of water added. The dose for adults is one teaspoonful every hour, and for children smaller doses according to age. Murray writes: "The medicine is harmless and recommended by the best schools of Paris. He says further: 'I have cured my children of scarlet fever and others of small pox when the doctors said the patient must die. Either disease under this treatment will disappear in twelve hours. If the countries would compel their physicians to use it, there would be no need of pest houses.'—Silver City.
