THE ANNEXATION OF TEXAS.  
TYLER'S MESSAGE.

There may be danger in this matter, let none deny it. Mr. Tyler may have connived with Texas for its admission into this Union; witness troops, and men of war of the United States, sent to protect Texas, before the treaty of annexation was ratified by the Senate.

By virtue of the broad authority of the treaty-making power, Texas may be admitted as a Territory or as a State; but by virtue of an act of Congress, she cannot be admitted as a Territory, but merely as a new State.

Now it is certain that Mr. Tyler, in his late message, recommends that Texas be annexed by act of Congress—and the effect of this great political movement—the invasion of the province of the treaty-making power—must be studied to be understood.

CONGRESS CANNOT BE TOO CAUTIOUS in framing the terms of annexation, to prevent litigation. The treaties which Texas has made with other powers, and with Indian tribes will not be annulled by annexation; and as the treaties which the United States has made would be binding on Texas—there may be conflicts of large interests, growing out of this matter, which the wisdom of Congress should guard against, as early as possible.
