Review of the Baltimore Market.

For the week ending Friday afternoon, June 6, 1845.
Coupons. Coupons have slightly advanced and are now selling at 75 1/2.

Provisions. The provision market, with a few days, has had an upward tendency, with small sales of Beef and Pork at a slight advance, say 1/4 for superior Baltimore mess Pork, and 1/4 for Prime, 50c for also near of sales of Western mess Beef at 29.50, and No. 1 at 28.50, on time. We quote Baltimore Mess Pork \$12.00; Prime \$10.00; Western Beef \$10.00; No. 1 \$9.50, and Prime 50c; Mess Beef \$10.00; No. 1 \$9.50, and Prime 50c; Western Beef \$10.00; No. 1 \$9.50, and Prime 50c.

Grain. The sales of wheat are quite limited, and will probably consist of the new crop arrivals. Md. good to prime reds are worth 90c, ordinary good 85c, and good white 10c. Pennsylvania red is selling at 90c, and ordinary to good at 85c. Pa. white is worth 90c, and ordinary to good at 85c for white, and 84c for reds. We note a sale of Pa. yellow at 4c. Pa. red is selling at 50c, no Maryland red in market. We quote Md. Oats at 25c, and sales of Pa. do. at 25c.

Cattle. There was a fair supply of Beef Cattle offered at the scales this week, numbering about 300 head, of which 225 were sold to the butchers at prices ranging from 52 to 58 net. The average rate of sales was about \$1.12 on the hoof. The supply of Live Hogs is large, and the demand being limited, prices have declined to 24.00.

Poultry. The market has been dull and the transactions limited this week, in consequence of the stock on hand of all descriptions, being exceedingly light. Howard st. good mixed brands from store, at 24c, and with small sales at night rates. Dealers are still paying \$1.37 for chickens. City Mills fresh ground flour is held at 54 1/2 c. Small sizes of extra brands at 55, and of old inspection at 54 1/2. Limited retail sales of Superfine flour at \$1.50, and of No. 1 flour at 53. Sales of Corn Meal at 25 1/2 c. and \$1 per 100 lbs.

The inspections of the week comprise the following kinds and quantities: 4901 white, and 207 half lbs. Howard street. 5002 do 1403 do City Mills. 1315 do 00 do Pennsylvania. 370 do 4 do Family Flour.

Wool. The receipts this week have been about 10,000 lbs., most of which has found buyers at 16c for unwashed; 2c for common to 1 blood tub or three washed; 2c for 1 to 4 blood tubs; 2c for 5 to 6 blood tubs; 2c for 7 to 8 blood tubs; and 3c for 9 to 10 blood tubs. Prices have a downward tendency, and will probably rise about 20 per cent. below last season's prices, in consequence of the large increase of the growth, and the great quantity of the supply among the manufacturers to engage extensively in business.

Sugar. There has been no auction sales this week. At private sales, New Orleans sugar has been taken at \$5.00 per 100. Stock in first hands light and market dull.

Molasses. We hear of only small private sales of New Orleans. The market is quiet, and few transactions have occurred. Rio, at private sale, has been taken at 7 1/2 c. The stock on hand is pretty large.

Potatoes. There is a fair supply of potatoes at the market, and they are selling at 65c per bushel, by the quantity, and 75c per bushel in small lots.

Spirits. Whiskey continues dull, and the stock being large, the price declined to-day in 10c in hogs, and 2c in bats. We quote N. E. Rum at 30c, and 2c in bats.

Tobacco. Md. and Ohio tobacco is coming in in large quantities, so much so that the stock of unsmoked is fast increasing. There is a good demand for the better qualities, while those of inferior sorts are dull. We quote as follows: Maryland inferior and common, \$1.50 to \$2.00; middling to good \$2.50 to \$3.00; good to extra \$3.50 to \$4.00; Virginia, \$4.00 to \$5.00; common to middling, \$2.50 to \$3.00; good \$3.00 to \$3.50; fine red and wrappry, \$4.00 to \$5.00; good \$5.00 to \$6.00; and extra wrappry, \$1.00 to \$1.50.

Hides and Leather. No sales of Hides this week, and no change in Leather.

Flour. Sales to a fair extent. No. 1 Herring at 32 1/2 c, but to dry they declined to 34 1/2 c. We quote No. 2 at 34 1/2 c, Sales of trimmed Shad at 75c 75c, and of untrimmed at 75c. We quote No. 1 Mackerel at 12 1/2 c, No. 2 at 10 1/2 c, and No. 3 at 9 1/2 c. Cod fish is worth 25c per barrel.

Rice. We quote sales at \$3.62 and 75, and extra quality at \$4 per 100 lbs., according to quality—demand fair.

Flax. The supply of wood on the wharves is large—sales of Hickory at \$1.50; Oak \$2.75 to \$3.25; and Pine \$2.00 to 75c per cord; stave Coal \$4.00 to 50c per ton.

Beans. Small sales at 25c per 100.

Seeds. We quote prime Cloverseed at \$4.25 and \$4.00. Timothy is worth \$3.25 and 13c, and \$3.00 per bushel.

Plaster. Sales of Lump at \$2.62 and 75 per ton—We quote ground at \$1.00 per bushel.
