MOLASSES.—The transactions this week are larger than for some time past. We note sales of 300 hhd. Cuba at 22 1/2 cts., and a lot of old crop New Orleans, in hhd., at 24 1/2 cts. We quote New Orleans, new crop, at 22 cts.; old crop at 21 1/2 cts.; Porto Rico at 26 1/2 cts.; and Cuba at 21 1/2 cts. At auction, 80 hhd. new crop New Orleans were sold at 25 1/2 cts.; and 100 hhd. old crop do. at 24 1/2 cts. The imports this week are 550 hhd. from New Orleans.

PROVISIONS.—There has been a little more activity in the transactions in Bacon. In other products there has been no material change.

Pork.—Small sales of Old Mess at \$10.50, and 50,000 lbs. new bulk Shoulders on private terms.

Beef.—Small sales of New No. 1 at \$12 and of No. 2 at \$11.

Lard.—We note sales of 100 kegs new at 7 1/2 cts. Small sales of Lard in kegs, at 6 1/2 cts. cash. Small sales of 100 kegs Western at 8 1/2 cts. and 40 kegs, do at 8 cts. 4 mos. Small sales of Glades are making at 17 cts.

Cheese.—Considerable sales of Western Reserve at 7 cts. and of Eastern at 7 1/2 cts.

RICE.—Small sales at 3 50 to 3 75 per 100 lbs.—The receipts of the week are 235 casks from Charleston and 57 casks from Savannah.

SPICES.—Sales of New England Rum in kegs, at 31 cts. Whiskey—Prices have been pretty uniform throughout the week at 28 cts. for bris. with occasional sales at 27 1/2 cts. Today we quote bris. at 28 cts. and hhd. at 27 cts. The inspections of the week are 5 hhd. and 673 bris., of which 5 hhd. and 271 bris. were received by the Tide Water Canal.

SUGARS.—There was an improved feeling in the Sugar market early in the week in consequence of the reduction in the stock in first hands by shipments to New York. Since then, however, there has been less animation. Among the transactions we note sales of 150 hhd. Cuba Muscovado at 3 50 to 5 25; 150 hhd. Porto Rico at 5 50; and 150 hhd. New Orleans old crop, at 5 25 to 5 50. The stock in first hands is now rather small, being reduced to about 1500 hhd. of all kinds. We quote New Orleans, old crop, at 5 50 to 5 75; Porto Rico at 5 50 to 5 75; and Cuba at 5 50 to 5 75. At auction, 150 hhd. New Orleans, new crop, were sold at 5 50 to 5 75; 96 bris. New Orleans Leaf at 7 05 to 7 10; and 60 bris. powdered at 7 10. The imports this week are 188 hhd. from Cuba, and 50 hhd. from New Orleans.

TOBACCO.—There is a good inquiry for Maryland Tobacco, but the receipts are light, and the stock is consequently limited in extent. Prices are well sustained, but no further advances has yet been realized. We quote inferior and common Maryland 2 50 to 3 50; sound common 3 50 to 4 50; good 5 50 and fine 7 50 to 8 00. There is a good demand for Ground Leaf, and the receipts sell readily at 3 50 to 4 50, average 3 75 to 4 00. There is no movement in the market. The stocks are small and the demand moderately active. We quote as before, viz: Common Ohio at 3 50 to 3 75; good 4 50 to 5 00; fine red wrapper 6 50 to 7 00; fine yellow 9 50 to 11 00; and extra wrapper 10 50 to 12 00. Nothing doing in Kentucky Tobacco. The inspections of the week comprise 262 hhd. Maryland, 153 hhd. Ohio, and 70 hhd. Kentucky.—Total 485 hhd.

WOOL.—We note sales of 1000 lbs. assorted, common top to three-quarter fleece, at 31 to 33 cts.

FREIGHTS.—Two ships are taking in Freight to Great Britain at 6 1/2 bushel; 25 per cent, and 25 per cent. There are no vessels loading with tobacco. A vessel was engaged this week to take coal to Rio Janeiro at 8 1/2 per ton. We quote to the West Indies at 60 to 70 cts.—two or three vessels taken up this week at the above rates. There is a better inquiry for coasting vessels, but no advance has been realized in the price of freights. We quote to Boston at 5 cts. per bushel, and to New York, 4 1/2 cts. per bushel, and 1 50 to 1 60 per ton for iron and coal.

BEEF CATTLE.—The supply of Beeves at the Scales on Monday fell considerably short of the number offered last week, and prices ruled something higher. There was only a small lot sold at the higher price, being considered extra quality. The offerings reached 1400 head of Beeves, of which 770 were sold to city butchers and packers, 220 were left over unsold, and 410 were driven to Philadelphia.—Prices ranged from 2 25 to 3 50 on the hoof, equal to 4 50 to 5 75 net, and averaging 5 25 gross.—Hogs.—In the early part of the week the market was quiet, owing to the uncommon warmth of the season. Since then the weather has been more suited for curing, and packers have entered upon their duty with much spirit. We quote from 4 to 5 25.
