Local Intelligence.

MARYLAND COAL TRADE.—For the week ending Saturday, July 30th, 8,049,18 tons of coal were shipped over the Cumberland and Pennsylvania Railroad, and 5,294,16 over the road of the George's Creek Coal and Iron Company.

ENDED AT LAST.—The case of Horace and James Reesley against the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, we notice has been finally decided by the Court of Appeals, and the judgment for \$5,000 in favor of the Messrs. Reesley, has been affirmed.

APPEALS.—At the first trial the jury gave a verdict for \$5,000. The Company took the case to the Court of Appeals, where the ruling of the Court, on certain points of law, was reversed, and the case sent back for a second trial.
