Terms of the Civilian & Telegraph.

TWO DOLLARS per annum, strictly in advance.

THE LAW OF NEWSPAPERS.

Subscribers order the discontinuance of their newspapers, the publisher may continue to send them until all arrears are paid.

If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their newspapers from the office to which they are directed, they are held responsible until they have settled the bills and ordered them discontinued.

Advertisements made to other places without informing the publisher, and the newspapers are sent to the former direction, they are held responsible.

The publishers have decided that refusing to take newspapers from the office, or removing, and leaving them uncalled for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

Proceedings of meetings out of a general character, charged at 4 cents per line for each insertion.

Yearly advertisers must confine their advertising to their own business.

Advertisements for notices, outside the city of Cumberland, cash in advance.

Persons ordering the insertion of legal advertisements will be held responsible for payment for the same when the time for which they were ordered to be inserted shall have expired.

INSOLVENT NOTICES, cash in advance.

PAID UP MORTGAGES, one half in advance and the balance in six months.

ALL JOB WORK, cash.
