A SCHOOL for classical and scientific education will be opened in the lower east room of the Cumberland Allegany county Academy, on Monday, the 4th day of January 1864.
The course of instruction in this school, will be elevated and thorough, embracing the elementary branches of an English education, the Physical, Mathematical and Moral Sciences and the Latin and French Languages, Physiology and Anatomy so much neglected in our system of education, will receive special attention as they give us a knowledge of our physical and mental structure, and the conditions or laws for our guidance in the preservation of our mental and bodily health, elements so essential to human happiness, usefulness and progression. The uses of knowledge or its connection or bearing on all the pursuits of life will be daily explained on, thus showing the pupil why he toils, and directing his ambition in right channels from right motives.
To insure order, system, punctuality and subordination of the pupils devoted to duty; a high sense of rectitude will always be appraised and the value of the same will be the pupil's respectability and success in the struggles of life will be earnestly dwelt upon.
The aim of the teacher, in short will be, to teach what he does teach after the most approved method of imparting knowledge, to render knowledge as practical and pleasing to the youthful mind as possible, and to lead into the scholar's love of virtue and hatred of vice that will in all circumstances insure the performance of duty.
The scholastic year will consist of ten months, divided into three sessions.
The first session begins January 4th, 1864, and terminates April 1st.
The 2d session begins April 11th, and terminates July 15th.
The 3d session begins September 5th, and terminates December 23d, 1864.
The tuition for each session will be \$10 in advance, exclusive of contingent expenses.

THE BOARD OF CLAY'S will hold its session at 101 SOUTH STREET, Baltimore, where Special copies of all muster-roll rolls and recruiting lists will be filed and open for the examination of claimants.
I. Claims must be presented within ten days of the filing of said rolls, viz: on or before the 15th day of MARCH, 1864.
II. No claim will be received or entertained from any person who has or has been engaged in rebellion against the Government of the United States, or who, in any way, has aided or comforted the enemies of the Government.
III. Loyal persons who have offered their services for enlistment, or who also have an application for compensation, such application to be accompanied by a certificate of enlistment from the recruiting office, and satisfactory proof of title; also a valid deed of manumission and release of service of the parties concerned.
IV. In proof of title, the claimant will be required to present an affidavit of ownership, in which must be stated the time when he or she became proprietor of the vessel, and if he or she is not the proprietor, he or she must be accompanied by the sworn testimony of at least two loyal citizens, residing in the neighborhood and not members of the same family, substantiating the fact of ownership of the vessel.
The following oath will likewise be required: "I do solemnly swear, that I have not purchased or otherwise obtained the vessel, or any part thereof, from any person or persons, who are or have been engaged in rebellion against the Government of the United States, with a view of obtaining compensation therefor, and that I have no agency for obtaining compensation for any person or persons but such as, to my knowledge, are loyal citizens of the United States." For the full terms of this regulation, and for the manner of applying for compensation, see the regulations of the Board of Claims, which will be published in the next issue of the Standard.
