Tillage vs. Manure.

Can thorough tillage be substituted for manure? Old Jethro Tull asserted that it could; and although the assertion was vehemently disputed, Jethro Tull, in his day and generation, had many agricultural disciples who believed in him and who illustrated their belief by practicing what he taught.

It is very singular that men should quote exceptional cases, as if they were of general application. Jethro Tull was right; his disciples were right; and Mr. Smith, of Louis Weodon, is right. But they are wrong, and totally wrong, nevertheless, when they seek to apply their theory to all cases and manners of soils.

In heavy compact clays and clay loams, such as Tull worked in, and Smith, of Louis Weodon continues to spade up with the happiest results, thorough tillage might well supersede for quite a number of years, the use of manures. All the requisite elements of fertility were locked up in those clays and clay loams, and they only needed liberating by the process which Tull so earnestly recommended.

Moreover, no soil produces so well, even under ordinary circumstances, as that which has been deeply ploughed and completely pulverized—and the nearer field tillage can be brought to garden culture, the larger the crops will be and the more certain will be the yield.

These are truths, which, if known, were not generally appreciated a hundred years ago, and are but imperfectly understood even in our own times. Tull's enthusiastic teachings were not therefore wholly without avail. His greatest fault was that he carried his theory too far. This laid him open to the attacks of his enemies and his reputation suffered by it.

But the truths he taught, were truths, nevertheless, and as such are deserving of consideration. That even clay lands will become exhausted by constant tillage after the lapse of many years, if the constituents that are taken off by the crops are not replaced by manure, no one will deny. But in such lands the process of exhaustion is comparatively slow, for they are great absorbers and annually collect and retain, from dew and rain and snow, and from the atmosphere generally, a considerable portion of those fertilizing elements which they lose by the annual crops.
