McLane, both of whom are adults and reside in Cecil County; Allen McLane, who intermarried with Celia McLane, both of whom are adults and reside in the City of Wilmington, in the State of Delaware; Florence Smith, who intermarried with Frank Smith, both of whom are adults and reside in the City of Camden, in the State of New Jersey; Mabel Moore, who intermarried with Joseph Moore, both of whom are adults and reside in the State of Pennsylvania; and the latter residing in New Castle County, in the State of Delaware; Carl H. McLane, who intermarried with Mary McLane, both of whom are adults and reside in the City of Wilmington, in the State of Delaware; Ernest McLane, who intermarried with Mamie McLane, both of whom are adults and reside in the City of Wilmington, in the State of Delaware; Louise Royal, who intermarried with William H. Royal, both of whom are adults and reside in the City of Baltimore, in the State of Maryland.

The bill prays for a sale of the real estate of which the said Allen McLane died seized and possessed and for a division of the proceeds thereof among the parties in interest and alleges that the said real estate is not susceptible to division without loss and injury to the parties in interest and prays for general relief.
