

### News In Brief

Red Men of Washington, Carroll and Frederick counties will attend the tenth anniversary of Logan Tribe, at Barnsboro, on October 21.

County Constable James Taylor, of New Castle, Del., was recently arrested in Wilmington on the charge of driving an automobile without a proper license.

The steamer "Canendough", built for New York parties, was launched at Milford, Del., last week.

Because of the increase in the price of bread, Polish residents of Wilmington are considering the advisability of starting a community bakery.

The case against Samuel L. Burris, charged with violating the election law at a primary in Wilmington, has been continued by the Court of General Sessions until next term.

Samuel D. Rhoades has been appointed Justice of the Peace at Hancock.

The Dorchester County School Board has determined to consolidate the school on Taylor's Island.

Two men were injured and eight others had narrow escapes when a 12-ton truck broke through a wooden bridge on the Keedysville-Rohrersville road.

Dr. William P. McKnown, a dentist of Federalsburg had a narrow escape Friday of last week from serious injury when a vulcanizer exploded while carrying 300 pressure. It wrecked a gasoline stove and some furniture in the room, but Dr. McKnown saved himself by jumping out of the way, escaping with slight burns on the face.

Samuel N. Trump, president and one of the founders of the Trump Brothers' Machine Co., and a descendant of one of the first Dutch families to settle in America, died on October 5 at Silverside, Del., aged 81 years. The deceased was a native of Baltimore. A widow, four sons and two daughters survive.

Mr. and Mrs. James Oliver Edmondson, of Havre de Grace, have issued invitations to the marriage of their daughter, Elva Marie, to Mr. George Reid Herring, of Aberdeen. The wedding will take place in the Methodist Episcopal Church, on Wednesday afternoon, October 18, at 4 o'clock.

James W. Foster and Arthur C. Foster are named as executors in the last will of Henry C. Foster, late of Havre de Grace, filed in the Orphans' Court for Harford county.

Mr. Edward F. Veasey, father of Mr. William E. Veasey, of Havre de Grace, was nominated by the Democrats for Sheriff of Sussex county, Delaware. His majority over the next highest man was 800.

A vaccination certificate is no longer necessary for children entering the public schools of Washington county. The county school board has passed an order to that effect.

It is reported that Indian Head soon will have two banks, branches of the Eastern Shore Trust Company and of the Southern Maryland Bank of La Plata. Directors of the latter institution met a number of citizens of the town recently and plans for establishing the branch were considered. The payrolls of the Naval Proving Ground and the Naval Powder Factory are nearly \$1,000 a week and there is no banking facility within 15 miles.

The Circuit Court has given the Allegany County Commissioners permission to borrow \$10,000 for the use of the Road Directors of the county, to meet requirements on roads and bridges, the fund at their command having run low. The amount is to be provided for in the next levy.

### Elkton Town Council

Elkton, Md., October 4, 1916. Town Council met in regular session at 8 p. m., with W. H. Mackall, President, in the chair. Councilmen present Davis, Magraw, McKenney, Pippin, Treasurer A. Victor Davis and Bailiff Potts. Minutes of meeting Sept 20 read and approved.

Treasurer reported receipts to date, \$7145.00; total disbursements, \$2600.20. Balance, \$4544.80. The following bills were read and ordered paid:

Keys & Miller Lumber Co., \$160.68; Gilbert Falls Electric Co., \$160.50; Maryland Water Co., \$412.50; F. P. Price, \$7.08; C. & P. Telephone Co., \$8.33; John Morgan, \$4; William Hughes, \$23.50; John McCool, \$11.68; George Walker, \$16.50; C. S. Bouden, \$20.75; Harry Garner, \$13.55; Bedford Noakes, \$40.25; William McDowell, \$16.50; George Potts, \$60; James Short, \$18.15; A. Victor Davis, \$20.83; Cadmus Price, \$25.75; Levin J. Houston, \$25.00; Cecil Whig Pub. Co. \$12.00.

The Board took up the matter of a crossing and pavement on North street, extended, and decided in view of the fact that we are now having curb lines and grades established it would be unwise to put in a concrete pavement at this time. It was moved and seconded that a crossing be placed opposite the Evans Dunbar property and the sidewalk be given a coat of granite; also the sidewalk fixed in front of Short's store, Blue Ball Road and High street. Davis and McKenney were named a committee on this work.

It was moved and seconded that the President be named as a committee to look into the matter of new heating arrangements for Council Hall. The present arrangement being unsafe since the chemical auto trucks are housed in the building. This motion was carried.

Resolved, That the Maryland Water Co. be required to extend its water mains along Railroad avenue with fire plugs at Bow street and Singlerly avenue. Moved and seconded that resolution be passed. This was carried. Adjourned.


