

COMMERCIAL RECORD. BALTIMORE PRICES CURRENT AND REVIEW OF THE MARKET.

Office of the Pilot and Transcript. GENERAL REMARKS—Business generally remains in much the same state as at our last review of the market.

EXCHANGE—Deaths at sight on Boston 5 per cent premium; New York 6 1/2 per cent; Philadelphia 1 per cent discount; Cincinnati 5 per cent; N. Carolina 2 per cent; Charleston flat premium.

AMERICAN COTTON GOODS.—There has been very little doing in this description of goods, they are still held however, at our former quotations, with the exception of brown goods, which have fallen of a 1/2 per cent.

CATTLE.—There were about 200 head offered this week and the greater part sold at prices ranging from \$3 50 to \$7 50.

HOGS.—Sold at \$5 25 to \$5 50; fair supply. COFFEE.—We note sales at 10 1/2 cts. per lb for ordinary to prime; also, a sale of 150 bags at 11 1/2 cts. since our last quotation.

HAVANA.—At auction on Thursday, 14 bbls and 4 tierces Havana Coffee were sold at prices ranging from 9 1/2 to 9 cts.
