MILITARY INTELLIGENCE. General Staff—Major L. Thomas, A. G., has been relieved from duty with the army of the South. Capt. W. S. Bliss, of the Adj. General's department, assigned to succeed him, and ordered to report to the commanding General.

NAVY INTELLIGENCE. The U. S. ship Delaware, 74, Captain Charles W. Skinner, dropped down by the Cayman Rocks, on Saturday, to the anchorage of the naval hospital. The Delaware is employed as a receiving ship and school for the naval apprentices.

The dying struggle of the administration is to make an impression that Gen. Harrison is an imbecile old man, in the hands of a committee, and letters from the Cincinnati committee are quoted to prove it. We give below one of these letters, which, like all that have been written, refer to Gen. Harrison's published opinions, and contains the declaration that the committee are preparing a pamphlet, containing what he has said on the subject before the country, and refers the public to that pamphlet, when it is published, as the recognised authority of his present opinions.

Will Mr. Van Buren issue such a pamphlet? Will he commit himself thus? We are indebted to a southern paper for the following, which is a conclusive answer to all Mr. Grundy and Amos Kendall can say in relation to the committee;

"HARRISON AND HIS KEEPERS AGAIN.—Dr. H. Alexander, of Palestine, Illinois, under date of March 3d, 1840, wrote Gen. Harrison, with a view of obtaining answers to the following questions—

"Has Congress the right, without the consent of the people of the District and of the States of Maryland and Kentucky, to abolish slavery in the District of Columbia?"

"Or, if President, would you veto or sanction a bill, passed by Congress in compliance to the petitions of the abolitionists of the present day, abolishing slavery in the District of Columbia, or Territory, or prohibiting the removal of slaves from the States?"

To which Gen. Harrison's guardians returned the following answer:— CINCINNATI, March 20, 1840.

Dear Sir,—Your letter of the 3d inst., addressed to Gen. Harrison, has been placed in my possession, with a view to early attention. This rendered necessary in consequence of the very many letters received by the General, and which his reply in person would be altogether impracticable.

For a correct and full understanding of Gen. Harrison's views upon the different subjects referred to in your letter, we call your attention to the various resolutions of the Cincinnati Convention, which are now embodying in pamphlet form, all the expressed opinions of the General upon the important questions of the day, which will be forwarded you at the earliest moment.

For the benefit of our abolition friends, we make an extract or two from the Vincennes speech referred to:—

"Am I wrong, fellow-citizens, in applying the terms weak, presumptuous and unconstitutional to the measures of the emancipators? A slight examination will, I think, show that I am not."

"Every movement which is made by the Abolitionists in the non-slaveholding states, is received by our Southern brethren as an attack upon their rights, and which, if persisted in, must in the end eradicate those feelings of attachment and affection between the citizens of all the States, which are produced by a community of interests and dangers in the war of the Revolution, and by a continuance of which, it can alone be preserved.
