GERMAN REPLY ABOUT JULY 8

President Wilson Plans to Return to Washington to Consider Note July 9 or 10.

Cornish, N. H., July 3.—President Wilson has received official information from Washington that Germany's reply to the last American note on submarine warfare may be expected about July 8, and in consequence he expects to return to Washington July 9 or 10 in order to consider the note with Secretary Lansing and other members of his cabinet.

President Wilson spent most of the day studying in quiet seclusion the general European question, including the possibilities of bringing about peace. He had before him confidential reports of Colonel E. M. House, Ambassador Gerard, Secretary Lansing and several other officials. He has been gathering these reports for several months and is now taking the opportunity offered by freedom from minor worries to go over them and familiarize himself with the foreign situation.
