YAQUIS BURN 60 PASSENGERS

SET CAR ON FIRE NEAR TORRES, SONORA.

Indian Deserters from Mexican Factional Army Derail Southern Pacific Train.

San Diego, Cal., Sept. 27.—Eighty passengers of a Southern Pacific Mexican train were thrown into a car containing hay and the car set on fire by a band of Yaqui Indians near Torres, Sonora...

Only 20 Passengers have been accounted for thus far, the others having been burned to death.

The Indians, according to the report, numbered about 60 and were deserters from one of the Mexican factional armies. They first derailed the train. Most of the passengers were women and children. No Americans were on the train.

U. S. Holds Up Ammunition. Laredo, Texas, Sept. 27.—United States customs officials held up half a million rounds of cartridges and a large number of army rifles, destined for use by the Carranza forces, on orders said to have emanated from Washington. All shipments of ammunition will be so held pending further orders, it was said here.

Detained for Investigation. Washington, Sept. 27.—Treasury department officials explained that the shipment of arms held up at Laredo had been detained merely for "investigation."

SLAVS HOLD BACK GERMANS

Russians Possess Fortress Triangle, including Dubno, Kovno and Lutsk—Repuise Austrians.

London, Sept. 27.—Some of the fiercest fighting of the campaign is in progress on the Russian front. The Germans continue their furious attacks in an effort to drive the Russians out of Lvov, while in Volhynia and Galicia the Russians continue to harass the Austro-Germans, who had designs on Kiev, from which town they are now further away than they were a few weeks ago.

Austrians Driven Back. General Ivanoff apparently is determined to hold back the Austro-Germans and his efforts are meeting with success. The fortress triangle, which includes Dubno, Kovno and Lutsk, is almost entirely in the possession of the Russians. In Galicia the Austrians have been driven back across the rivers which run parallel to the border. The Italians, like the rest of the Allies, report a number of successes in taking fortified mountains from the Austrians.

Freight Train Kills Widow. St. Cloud, Minn., Sept. 27.—Mrs. John Mortes, a widow, 74 years old and resident of Avon, near this city, was struck by a freight train while plowing up wheat in the Avon freight yards and instantly killed. She leaves three sons and two daughters.

Austria Must Recall Dumba.

Washington, Sept. 27.—Ambassador Frederick C. Penfield at Vienna has been instructed to make clear to the Austrian government informally that the United States must insist on the recall of Dr. Constantin Dumba, the Austrian ambassador here, and that his departure "on leave of absence" would not be satisfactory. From messages exchanged between Ambassador Penfield and the state department it is apparent that the Austrian government understood the desires of the
