Happenings of the Week Briefly Told  
 for the Convenience of the  
 Busy Reader.

The First regiment, Minnesota na-  
 tional guard, will encamp at Lake City  
 July 19-19, the Second regiment July  
 20-29, and the Third regiment June  
 20-29.

Through efforts of County Attorney  
 H. O. Kjomme and a detective whole-  
 sale arrests were made at Thief River  
 Falls of persons charged with boot-  
 legging.

About 150 paving block cutters are  
 on strike at St. Cloud as the result of  
 the failure of the employers to agree  
 to an increase of one quarter of a cent  
 a block.

John Ostapchuk has been indicted  
 by the grand jury of Dakota county  
 for murder in the first degree for the  
 killing of his wife at South St. Paul  
 March 16.

Rough fish to the value of \$27,750  
 were taken from lakes in Martin county  
 the past winter by seiners and the  
 state received a little more than \$6,000  
 as its share.

Mrs. L. T. Sheetz, prominent in Min-  
 neapolis club circles, died at Seattle,  
 Wash., when about to return to Minne-  
 apolis from California, where she had  
 spent the winter.

A ten-acre tract of land three miles  
 south of East Grand Forks has been  
 sold for \$160 an acre, probably the  
 highest price ever paid for land in the  
 Red River valley.

W. G. Calderwood of Minneapolis  
 has filed for United States senator on  
 the prohibition ticket. Mr. Calder-  
 wood expects to make a statewide  
 speaking campaign.

Francis R. Seymour, a farmer of  
 Aldrich, forty-six years old, is dead  
 at Brainerd from blood poisoning which  
 developed after he had all his teeth  
 extracted at Wadena.

Maich Jaakinen, forty-six years old,  
 committed suicide at Hibbing by shoot-  
 ing himself with a rifle. He is thought  
 to have brooded over a war argument  
 in which he was bested.

Under the provisions of the will of  
 his mother Dwight G. Cutler of Duluth,  
 aged thirty-one, must marry or wait  
 until he is forty-five years old before  
 he comes into his inheritance.
