Certificate of Amendment Articles of Incorporation of the NORTHERN LOG COMPANY

S. L. JOHNSON, Vice President of the Northern Log Company, a corporation, and Geo. Leng, Secretary of said corporation, do hereby certify and declare that they are respectively the Vice President and Secretary of said Northern Log Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota, and that at a special meeting of all of the stockholders and officers of said corporation held at the home of the Vice President, Grand Marais, Minnesota, on the 29th day of May, A. D. 1920, called for the expressly stated purpose of amending the Articles of Incorporation of said corporation, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted and approved by all of the stockholders and officers of said corporation, which said resolutions read as follows, to-wit:

That article one (1) of the articles of incorporation be amended so as to read:

"The name of this corporation shall be The North Woods Recreation Company.
The general nature of the business of this corporation shall be to buy, own, locate, enter, mortgage, sell, convey, construct, lease, manage, operate and deal in real estate and interest therein in severally or otherwise; cattle, horses and livestock and farm products and implements and machinery and merchandise; warehouses and docks; and also bonds, stocks, notes, mortgages, tax certificates, assignments and tax titles and other personal property in Minnesota and elsewhere in the United States, to lease, let, improve and cultivate real estate, and to market its products; to loan and borrow money; and to make, endorse guarantee and discount commercial paper; to act as agent for others, for a compensation in purchase, sale, managements and improvements of real and personal property; and to purchase, cut, log, market, sell and manufacture logs, ties, poles, pulpwood, timber and lumber products; to acquire, operate, lease or sub-lease real estate for the purpose of conducting, maintaining or operating hotels, restaurant and summer resorts of every kind and nature, and to do and perform all acts and things necessary proper or convenient for carrying out any of the aforesaid business.

That article three (3) be amended so as to read:
The amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) and the same shall be sold only at par, either for cash or for property and things of value deemed by the Board of Directors to be equivalent thereto. Such determination by the Board of Directors shall be deemed final and binding upon all parties interested.

Stock in this corporation shall be paid for as called for by the Board of Directors, and no stock which has not been subscribed for and upon which the payments have not been made, as required by the Board of Directors, shall be entitled to vote or representation in any of the proceedings of this company.
That article seven (7) be amended so as to read:
The capital stock of this corporation is divided into Seven Hundred Fifty (750) shares of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each.
That said resolution was unanimously adopted at said meeting and all of the stockholders of said company were present and said meeting was called for the expressly stated purpose of amending the Articles of Incorporation of said Company.

In Testimony whereof, the said S. L. JOHNSON, as Vice President of said corporation and Geo. LENG, as Secretary of said corporation, have hereunto set their hands and seals and hereunto attached the corporate seal of said corporation, this 29th day of May, A. D. 1920.
