

KLAN LAWLESSNESS DENIED

Courthouse Parley Refuses to Pass Resolutions Attacking 'Invisible Empire.'

Winder, Ga.—There is no basis for charges of lawlessness in Barron county, according to resolutions adopted at a mass meeting attended by several hundred persons in the county courthouse.

The meeting was called by B. L. Woodruff, foreman of the grand jury, which recently investigated conditions in the county, who alleges that threats had been made upon his life by the Ku Klux Klan.

Washington—The house rules committee voted to give privileged status to the Green resolution proposing an amendment to the constitution under which further issuance of tax exempt securities would be prohibited.

PICK OF ARMEN TO HUNT

San Diego, Calif.—Seventeen airplanes manned by the pick of the army's aerial forest patrol fliers and the most skilled cross country pilots in the air squadron of the Pacific battle fleet, will take wing from North Island to assist in the search for Col. Francis C. Marshall and Lieut. Charles L. Webber, missing aviators.

DIVIDENDS TAX CERTAIN

Congress Will Not Tax Undistributed Earnings, Says H. A. Harris.

Chicago—Congress will pass no tax on undistributed earnings, but some sort of a tax on stock dividends appears certain and there is likely to be a return of the excess profits tax, H. I. Archibald Harris, counselor in a counting and taxation to the Illinois and Indiana bankers' associations, declared in telegraphic advices from Washington received here.

LAUDS CO-OPERATIVE PLAN

Wallace and Klein Enthusiastic in Support of Movement.

Washington—Indorsement of co-operative marketing was expressed by President Harding, Secretary Wallace of the Department of Agriculture, and Dr. Julius Klein, chief of the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce of the Department of Commerce and by a number of representatives of farmers' organizations at the first meeting of the National Council of Farmers' Co-operative Marketing associations. National organizations marketing major commodities were represented by several hundred delegates from 35 states.
