A woman who had been watching him went up and found him dead.

The solution of gutta serena in chloroform warmly recommended by the late Professor Graves, of Virginia, has been much used in Germany, and has met with general favor. It has been used successfully in several cases of cutaneous diseases of the most obstinate type. Some experiments with chloroform as a local anæsthesia have been made in Dublin with good results.
