GOOSE HOLLOW.—This ancient and respectable portion of our liberties and part of the domain, of this considerable city, was completely washed out, by the rain on Monday night. The Montreal Chronicle of the 12th, states that the commissariat advertises for a vessel to convey six thousand barrels of cartridges from Quebec to England. The large consumption of ammunition in the present war not only exhausts all that the mills can make, but will cause the larger part of the contents of the provincial magazines to be called out of their slumbers into actual service.

THE POSITION OF AUSTRIA.—The London Examiner, of the 23d ult., in the course of an article on the present state of affairs in the East, says with some point:

The conduct and character of Germany in the present crisis cannot be better typified than by M. Hubner, the Austrian envoy in Paris. When Queen Victoria was there the other day in the midst of the fetes given by the Imperial Court to celebrate the anti-Russian alliance, Mr. Hubner got a convenient soar throat or leg, a diplomatic malady which excused him from being present. No sooner, however, do the guns of the Invalides announce the fall of Sebastopol, than M. Hubner recovers the use of his leg and contrives to sneak into Notre-Dame and join the crowds who are present at the *Te Deum* in honor of the great victory. Such has been, such is such ever will be Austria.

GREAT BATTLE WITH A FLEET OF PIRATES.—A dispatch of the 19th from Washington says:

The Navy Department has advised of an engagement between the U. S. steamer Powhatan and a large fleet of piratical war-junks in the Chinese seas, near Hong kong, which resulted in the destruction of ten war-junks, averaging eighteen guns each, from six to sixty-eight pounders. Sixteen of the smaller junks escaped. It is thought that between five and six hundred pirates were killed or wounded. The Powhatan had two killed and twelve wounded seriously. Among the latter were Lieuts. Pogram and Rolands.
