At Clinton, and Jackson, in this State, we are sorry indeed to learn that the late epidemic fever, still lingers. We learn from Mr. William Elder, that at Jackson night before last, a Miss Perry died of the fever; and at Clinton (when he left on Wednesday) our friend R. C. CARMAN, was dangerously ill, of the same.

Distinguished Arrivals.—Yesterday morning, His Excellency Gov. HEBERT, and the Hon. R. C. WICKLIFFS, Governor elect, arrived in Town.

An Attorney cannot be Committed for refusing to testify.—Our friend HALL, was summoned yesterday before the Grand Jury, to testify, to what he knows in reference to betting on elections.
