**INCENDIARISM AT CLISTON.**—For the past two weeks the citizens of Clifton, have had to patrol the place, to guard against incendiaries. Several attempts have lately, been made to fire the town.

**GREAT EXCITEMENT IN PLATTE COUNTY, MISSOURI.**—Chicago, Nov. 24.—There is much excitement in Platte county, Missouri, concerning the return of George Park to Parkville.—Park was formerly chief editor of the Parkville Luminary. Early last summer the office of the Luminary was sacked, press thrown into the river, and the editors driven from the country on account of their Abolition proclivities. Park has recently returned to Parkville, and ascertaining this fact, a committee appointed by the citizens of Platte county, went to Parkville and demanded that Park be delivered up to them. The citizens of Parkville refused to give him up, whereupon threats were made to burn the town.—The citizens of Parkville held a meeting, organized a large force, and have resolved to defend themselves. Here the matter rests at our last accounts. The most intense excitement is felt throughout the whole region.

A resolution has been introduced into the Tennessee Legislature, instructing their Senators and Representatives in Congress to use their utmost exertions to procure the passage of a law by Congress favoring the construction of the location of the Great Pacific Railroad along the route known as the "Southern Route" through Texas and appropriating to it all the patronage and means consistent with the policy and power of the General Government.

In the last Congress the House of Representatives, as nearly as it could be ascertained, stood at the opening of the first session—Democrats, 157, opposition 76; with vacancy. The present House, when it meets, will find its relative position nearly the exact converse of the last. As nearly as it can now be ascertained, there are 158 opposition members, to 76 Administration
