The Board of Registration. ORDINANCES CREATING THE BOARD.

NOTICE TO TAX COLLECTORS AND SHERIFFS.

COMMITTEE ROOMS, BOARD OF REGISTRATION, New Orleans, March 10, 1868.

The board of registration was organized by the election of S. B. Packard, chairman, and R. C. Richardson, secretary.

On motion, resolved, that the following ordinance and resolution creating said board and fixing its duties, be published in the official paper of this board:

ORDINANCE. WHEREAS, The act of congress of the twenty-third of March, 1867, sets forth as one of the purposes of the assembling of this convention to establish a civil government for the state;

Be it ordained by the people of Louisiana in convention assembled, that a board of registration for the reconstruction of this convention, to consist of seven members thereof, whose term of office shall begin with the adjournment of the convention, and shall be inaugurated on the first day of July next, and with the inauguration of state officers, as provided for in the constitution.

Be it further ordained, etc., that it shall be the duty of said board to select a chairman from among its members, and a secretary, and to hold public notices, proclamations, and orders as it may be directed by the president and the convention.

Be it further ordained, etc., that the said board shall have power and authority to make rules and regulations for the government of the reconstruction of voters, the duties of registrars, the holding of elections, the duties of commissioners of the respective polls, the making of returns, and the announcement of the result of the election.

Provided, That such rules, regulations, and orders shall in no way conflict with the provisions of the act of congress, and the constitution, or with the schedule or ordinance contained in the constitution to be submitted to the people of Louisiana.

Be it further ordained, etc., that they shall be empowered to administer oaths of office and the issuing of commissions to act in case of vacancy or the non-qualification of any officer.

Be it further ordained, etc., that it shall be the duty of said board to fix the salary and expenses of the officers of the reconstruction acts and the constitution, and the salary and expenses of the officers of the reconstruction acts and the constitution.

Be it further ordained, etc., that the board of registration created by this ordinance shall have power and authority to enforce the collection of the taxes levied by the several ordinances of the convention, and to perform any and all duties appertaining to the same.
