BOARD OF ASSISTANT ALDERMEN. Regular Session. City Hall, Tuesday, June 3, 1868.

Of Robert Alexander, for permission to erect a steam engine and boiler on his premises, No. 210 New Levee street. Referred to the Committee on Improvements and Buildings.

Of Jacques Clavel, praying for the lease of the iron building at the head of Canal street for the term of three years, was referred to the Finance Committee.

Of others in the several markets, recommending Betram Clavel as inspector of meat and slaughter-houses. Referred to the Committee on Police and Health.

Of Peter Hill, ex-assistant book-keeper in the Controller's office, stating that his name has been omitted on the payrolls of city officers for January, February, and March, and that he has not in consequence been paid his salary for said months, and praying for relief, was referred to the Finance Committee.

Of Henry Waler, for permission to establish a cooper shop on the vacant lot corner of Thaliaud and White streets, was referred to the Committee on Improvements and Buildings.

A communication of George W. Avery, sheriff of the parish of Orleans, stating that Judge Emerson had decided that the city is bound to receive all payments for debts in city money, but that a certain city official entertained a different opinion.

Mr. Sullivan stated that the sheriff had already received instructions from the Finance Committee to receive city currency in payment of all debts due the city, for taxes, road-rent, &c.

The communication was laid on the table. The Board adjourned until Tuesday, June 9th instant.
