Mr. Zacharie then moved for a recess of ten minutes. This was on motion of Mr. Pesson laid on the table by the following called vote: Yeas: Messrs. Boguille, Kaiser, O'Brien, Pesson, Poynot, and Shields-5. Nays: President Markey, and Messrs. Brady, and Zacharie-3.

The election being resumed, the seventh vote resulted as follows: For Mr. Poynot-President Markey, and Messrs. Boguille, Pesson, and Poynot-4. For Mr. Zacharie-Messrs. O'Brien and Zacharie-2.

For Blank-Messrs. Kaiser and Shields-2. No election. An eighth and a ninth vote resulted the same as the seventh.

A motion of Mr. Pesson to adjourn until tomorrow at six o'clock P. M. was lost, with the following called vote: Yeas: President Markey, and Messrs. Kaiser, Pesson, and Shields-4. Nays: Messrs. Boguille, O'Brien, Poynot, and Zacharie-4.

A tenth vote for chairman of Finance Committee was now taken as follows: For Mr. Poynot-President Markey, Messrs. Boguille, Pesson, and Poynot-4. For Mr. Zacharie-Messrs. O'Brien and Zacharie-2.

For Blank-Messrs. Kaiser and Shields-2. No election. On motion the Board then adjourned until tomorrow at 5 o'clock P. M.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN. Adjourned Session. CITY HALL, NEW ORLEANS, Wednesday, June 24, 1868.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, and was called to order by the President. Present: President Markey, Messrs. Boguille, Kaiser, O'Brien, Pesson, and Zacharie-7.

Reading of the minutes was dispensed with. On motion of Mr. Kaiser the Board went into the election of chairman of the Finance Committee.

Mr. Kaiser nominated Mr. Shields. Mr. Pesson nominated Mr. Poynot. Mr. O'Brien nominated Mr. Zacharie.

For Mr. Poynot-Messrs. Boguille, Pesson, and Poynot-3. For Mr. Shields-Messrs. Kaiser and Shields-2.

For Mr. Zacharie-President Markey, and Messrs. Brady, O'Brien, Pesson, and Zacharie-4. No election.

The Mayor, and inform him that this Board is organized, and ready to proceed to business. On motion of Mr. Kaiser, ordered that all unfinished business of the last Board be referred to the appropriate committees.

Mr. Zacharie, of the committee appointed to wait on the Mayor, reported that the committee had performed its duties, and that the Mayor had no communications to make at present.

The following resolution, offered by Mr. Shields, was adopted: Resolved, That there be a joint session of the Council on Tuesday, thirtieth instant, for the purpose of electing such officers as may be agreed upon at said session.

On motion of Mr. Pesson laid on the table by the following called vote: Yeas: Messrs. Boguille, Kaiser, O'Brien, Pesson, Poynot, and Shields-5. Nays: President Markey, and Messrs. Brady, and Zacharie-3.

The election being resumed, the seventh vote resulted as follows: For Mr. Poynot-President Markey, and Messrs. Boguille, Pesson, and Poynot-4. For Mr. Zacharie-Messrs. O'Brien and Zacharie-2.

For Blank-Messrs. Kaiser and Shields-2. No election. An eighth and a ninth vote resulted the same as the seventh.

A motion of Mr. Pesson to adjourn until tomorrow at six o'clock P. M. was lost, with the following called vote: Yeas: President Markey, and Messrs. Kaiser, Pesson, and Shields-4. Nays: Messrs. Boguille, O'Brien, Poynot, and Zacharie-4.

A tenth vote for chairman of Finance Committee was now taken as follows: For Mr. Poynot-President Markey, Messrs. Boguille, Pesson, and Poynot-4. For Mr. Zacharie-Messrs. O'Brien and Zacharie-2.

For Blank-Messrs. Kaiser and Shields-2. No election. On motion the Board then adjourned until tomorrow at 5 o'clock P. M.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN. Adjourned Session. CITY HALL, NEW ORLEANS, Wednesday, June 24, 1868.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, and was called to order by the President. Present: President Markey, Messrs. Boguille, Kaiser, O'Brien, Pesson, and Zacharie-7.

Reading of the minutes was dispensed with. On motion of Mr. Kaiser the Board went into the election of chairman of the Finance Committee.

Mr. Kaiser nominated Mr. Shields. Mr. Pesson nominated Mr. Poynot. Mr. O'Brien nominated Mr. Zacharie.

For Mr. Poynot-Messrs. Boguille, Pesson, and Poynot-3. For Mr. Shields-Messrs. Kaiser and Shields-2.

The Treasurer's report for the two weeks ending June 20, 1868, showing receipts of \$110,579.64, expenditures \$223,921.89, balance on hand \$21,115.72, was referred to the Finance Committee.

The Controller's statement of checks drawn by the Treasurer from June 2 to June 15, 1868, amounting to \$9188.75, was referred to the same committee.

The following report of the special Committee on Credentials appointed at the last meeting was received: To the Honorable Board of Assistant Aldermen: GENTLEMEN-Your committee on credentials...

On motion of Mr. Breen the Board took a recess of three quarters of an hour, at the expiration of which Mr. Breen moved to go into a permanent organization, the election of a president, a secretary, a sergeant-at-arms of this Board, and the chairman of the different committees.

Mr. Kearny was nominated and received the unanimous vote of the Board, and was declared duly elected president of the Board.

Mr. John Tobin was nominated for the office of secretary of the Board, received the unanimous vote of the Board, and was declared duly elected.

Mr. Charles Fonda was unanimously elected sergeant-at-arms. Mr. Gerald Farrell was unanimously elected chairman of the Committee on Streets and Landings.

Mr. Robert Wynne was elected chairman of the Committee on Police and Health. Mr. Tomatis was elected chairman of the Committee on Education.

Mr. Pandely was elected chairman of the Committee on Workhouse and Prisons. Mr. Breen was elected chairman of the Committee on Improvements and Buildings.

The following message of the Mayor was read, and ordered spread upon the minutes: To the Honorable Board of Assistant Aldermen: GENTLEMEN-In the whole history of municipal elections and organizations I am...

The co-ordinate branches of our newly organized city government are now fortunately composed of that conservative element desirous alike of the protection and prosperity of the people of New Orleans and the welfare of the State at large.

War and pestilence have been melancholy retarders of the growth and prosperity of our city. But look back upon the past, and you will be struck by the present stagnation in business and consequent lack of progression.

The following message from the same office and documents accompanying were ordered spread upon the minutes: To the Honorable Board of Assistant Aldermen: GENTLEMEN-Hereby transmitted is special order No. 137, current series, for the year 1868, containing the names of the members of the Board of Assistant Aldermen...

On motion the report was accepted and the committee discharged. On motion the Board went into the election of chairman of the Finance Committee.

Mr. Kaiser nominated Mr. Shields. Mr. Poynot nominated Mr. Brady. Mr. O'Brien nominated Mr. Zacharie.
