ALABAMA.

The Registration Bill and Election Law. MONTGOMERY, October 6.—The Governor has signed the registration bill passed by the Legislature.

The Senate bill make it a misdemeanor for any person to challenge a voter, punishable by fine and imprisonment. The Probate Judge of each county is to designate a number of voting places he deems fit. This is done to have all the voting at the courthouse.

The Democrats denounce the registration and election bills as frauds.
