FUNERAL OF COL. POPE.

Resolutions of Ex-Soldiers and Sailors Meeting.

A SOLEMN SCENE.

Honors to the Deceased!

In pursuance of notice, the ex-soldiers and sailors in New Orleans assembled to-day to do honor to the memory of their murdered comrade, Colonel H. H. Pope, formerly of the Thirty-third Illinois volunteers.

Since the close of the war Colonel Pope has resided in Louisiana. He was last spring elected sheriff of the parish of St. Mary, and the tragical circumstances of his murder in Franklin on the seventeenth instant are fresh in the mind of the whole country. He was assassinated on the porch of the Hotel where he was residing, and Judge Chase of Franklin was also murdered near his side. Colonel Pope left a wife and an infant child. We hope there is not a heart in New Orleans to-day that does not sympathize with the wife and child in this great and sudden grief.

A committee, consisting of Senator Kellogg, General McMillen, Governor Warrenton, General West and General Lee, yesterday requested the use of the Post Band and invited the Commanding General of the Department and his staff to attend the ceremonies of to-day. Their request was immediately acceded to and the invitation accepted in the following letter:

HEADQUARTERS DEPARTMENT OF LOUISIANA, New Orleans, Louisiana, October 21, 1868.

GENTLEMEN—Your note of last evening was duly received and read.

The band which was directed to report to you at twelve o'clock M., at the Mechanics' Institute, and I shall endeavor to be present with my staff to participate in the funeral ceremonies of the late Colonel H. H. Pope. Very truly, etc.

At twelve o'clock the ex-soldiers and sailors assembled at the Institute.

Meeting called to order by Sam H. Houston, and, on motion, Hon. Frank Morey was unanimously called to the chair and M. Marks, Esq., was appointed Secretary.

Motion made by General A. L. Lee, that the committee on resolutions be called upon for the resolutions, which were offered by General L. A. Sheldon, Chairman, as follows, to wit:

We, the ex-soldiers and sailors late of the United States Army, and now residing in the State of Louisiana, have read with grief and indignation the account of the assassination of Colonel Henry H. Pope, at Franklin in the parish of St. Mary, on the 17th inst., and we are deeply grieved that it might be passed over as one of those atrocious crimes which are committed in the name of the law, and which constitute only one instance of a long series of similar outrages actually perpetrated, and in conformity to the threats of the extended organizations, whose carnal principles seem to be violence and bloodshed committed upon individuals for the sake of political opinions, the occurrence of which has excited a just and alarm in the bosoms of all good citizens, and should arouse every lover of civilization and the rights of humanity to exert their efforts in arresting and bringing to condign punishment those who participate in or give countenance to these crimes against the peace and safety of the country.
