The Democratic party, I do not propose now to say with how much justice, has so conducted itself in its conduct that it has not previously reported its confidence in its unconditional and uncompromising adherence to the Union, or in its acceptance and approval of the effectual abolition of slavery.

LOCAL INTELLIGENCE.

BURGLARY.—The grocery, corner of Palmyra and Galvez streets, was entered last night by unknown parties, and robbed of nearly five dollars in greenbacks. A room in the same building was also entered, where a barber and his wife were sleeping, the intruder exchanging garments from head to foot, wearing of the barber's suit and leaving dirty and ragged clothes. The wife of the barber carried out into the back yard and left there.

PARAGRAPHS.—An unknown woman was found drowned in the river yesterday at the foot of Third street. She was the wife of a New Orleans to Donaldsonville, eighty miles, in four hours and fifty minutes.

YESTERDAY MORNING, as Mr. A. S. Dupre, his wife and daughter, were riding in a carriage at the corner of Jackson and Chestnut streets, the horse took fright, the vehicle was upset, and Miss Dupre was injured on the head and had an arm broken.

A fire broke out about eight o'clock last evening in an unoccupied house, owned by Peter Canfield, and situated on St. James street, between Sixth and Seventh streets. The kitchen was burned off, and the rear part of the main building was also partially destroyed. The fire is supposed to have been the work of an incendiary. The property was insured for \$10,000.

Tuesday night, James Dazan was dangerously stabbed by Leon Casella, in a saloon near the corner of Sixth and Seventh streets. The assailant escaped and the wounded man was taken home.

Two chivalrous gentlemen residing on Jackson street arranged to fight a duel this morning at the "Oaks." Captain Cain, the Superintendent of Police, interfered with the nice little plans.

Edward Callahan was he knocked down on St. Joseph street, between Camp and Magazine, Tuesday night, and robbed of \$30 in United States currency, by two men whose identity has not been ascertained.

The residence of Mr. H. M. Leads, on Poyfayette street, was entered by some unknown persons, who robbed it of parlor ornaments, silverware and a quantity of ladies' wearing apparel.

Yesterday morning the woodrack of the steamer Magnolia gave way, severely injuring William Robinson and Richard Allen, both colored, and another colored man slightly. The two former were taken to the Marine Hospital.

A man named Koo, residing at No. 283 Bourbon street, accidentally shot himself in the neck last night. The wound is supposed to be mortal.
