AMERICAN UNION CLUB. In deciding the case of A. Lejour vs. A. Jones et al., an action by plaintiff against the lessee, Jones and sureties, to recover of them, the defendants, the sum of \$237 50 and interest for the contract of the lease on the lease of a dwelling house from first December, 1863, to fourth December, 1867, and there being judgment in the lower court in favor of the plaintiff, the case was discharged from their liability by any act of plaintiff.

In the absence of the plaintiff the rule was made absolute, and the case was discharged from their liability by any act of plaintiff.
