THE SUPREME COURT.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS, THIS TRIBUNAL CLOSES ITS SESSIONS IN NEW ORLEANS TO-DAY.

IN NOTING THIS EVENT, IT BECOMES A DUTY WE OWE TO THE PUBLIC, AS A FAITHFUL JOURNALIST, TO BRIEFLY ALLUDE TO THE MOST IMPORTANT QUESTIONS THAT HAVE ARISEN, AND WHICH HAVE BEEN PASSED UPON BY THIS TRIBUNAL.

THE JUDICIARY IS ESSENTIALLY A BALANCE WHEEL, SO TO SPEAK, IN OUR CIVIL SYSTEM, AND UPON THE ABILITY AND INTEGRITY OF ITS ADMINISTRATION DEPENDS THE SAFETY AND PERMANENCY OF SOCIETY AND GOVERNMENT.

IT CAN NOT BE OVER-LOOKED BY THE OBSERVING WORLD THAT LOUISIANA OCCUPIES THE CENTRAL POSITION IN THE COMBINATION OF STATES LATELY IN REBELLION AGAINST THE GENERAL GOVERNMENT.

QUARANTINE. PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR. WHEREAS, AN ACT OF THE LEGISLATURE, APPROVED MARCH 13, 1870, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH QUARANTINE FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE STATE," PROVIDES THAT THE GOVERNOR SHALL, UPON THE ADVICE OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, ORDER ANY PLACE WHERE THERE SHALL BE REASON TO BELIEVE A PESTILENT, CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASE EXISTS, TO BE A QUARANTINE PLACE, AND STAYING THE NUMBER OF DAYS OF QUARANTINE TO BE PERFORMED BY THE VESSELS, THEIR PASSENGERS, OFFICERS AND CREW, COMING FROM SUCH PLACE OR PLACES.
