

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF LOUISIANA.

To be submitted to the people of the State at the next General Election, to be held on the seventh day of November, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

- Section 1. Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana in General Assembly convened, two-thirds of the members elected to each House agreeing thereto, That at the general election next ensuing the passage of this resolution, the following amendment to the constitution of the State shall be submitted to the people of this State, and if a majority of the voters at said election shall approve and ratify such amendment, the same shall become a part of the constitution, to wit: Article - No person who, at any time, may have been a collector of taxes, whether State, parish or municipal, or who may have been otherwise entrusted with public money, shall be eligible to the General Assembly, or to any other public office or trust under the State government, until he shall have obtained a discharge for the amount of such collections and for all public moneys with which he may have been entrusted.

Section 2. Be it further resolved, etc., That no person shall hold any office, or shall be permitted to vote at any election, or to act as a juror, who, in due course of law, shall have been convicted of treason, perjury, forgery, or any other crime punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary, or who shall be under interdiction.

Section 3. Be it further resolved, etc., That the tickets of all persons who are candidates for any office, or for the election of any office, shall be printed thereon the words, "For the amendment of the ninety-ninth article of the constitution," or "Against the amendment of the ninety-ninth article of the constitution," and the returning officers shall make returns of the votes thereon in the same manner as is prescribed by law for returns of the votes of the electors of the State.

Section 4. Be it further resolved, etc., That the following persons shall be prohibited from voting or holding any office: All persons who shall have been convicted of treason, perjury, forgery, bribery, or any other crime punishable in the Penitentiary, or who shall be under interdiction.
