CORPORATIONS.

CHARTER OF THE STATE OF LOUISIANA, No. 183, Chapter 183, Act of the Legislature of Louisiana, passed on the 15th day of August, A. D. 1848.

ARTICLE I. This Corporation shall be located and have its domicile in the city of New Orleans. It shall exist for a term of twenty years, unless sooner dissolved.

ARTICLE II. This Corporation shall be located and have its domicile in the city of New Orleans. It shall exist for a term of twenty years, unless sooner dissolved.

ARTICLE III. The object of this association shall be to contract for the insurance of life, and to do all acts relative to that kind of insurance.

ARTICLE IV. All administrative powers shall be vested in a board of directors, of whom seven shall form a quorum.

ARTICLE IX. The President shall appoint, before the expiration of the term of the present Board of Directors, three directors to succeed them, who shall be judges of election.
